

# American Millionaire R.J. Reynolds Dies

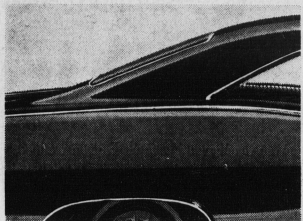

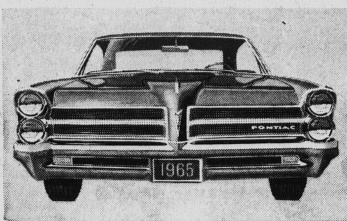

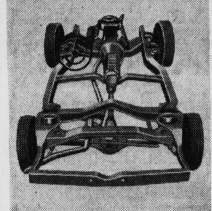

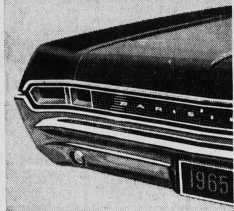

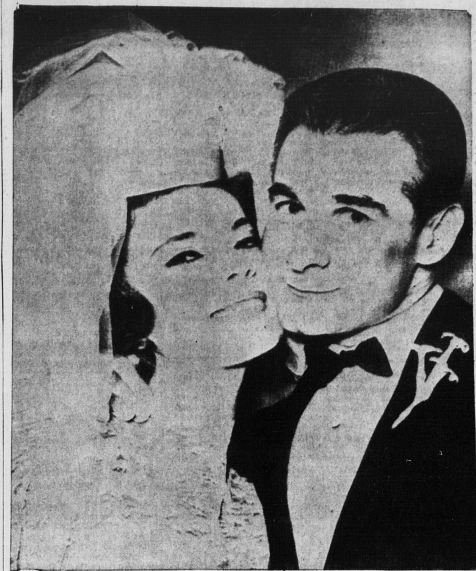

## Students Taking To Trains In Face Of Cold Weather

MONCTON, (Special) — Severe winter conditions throughout the Atlantic region appear to be bringing about one of the heaviest Christmas student movements ever for Canadian National Railways.

Indications are that most college students in the Maritimes and in Newfoundland will make their way home for the holidays by Canadian National this weekend.

With the majority of colleges and universities closing down for the holiday period Dec. 18 and 19, railway officials are expecting trains to be well patronized over the weekend as vacationing students from Atlantic area seats of learning make their way home, and students from colleges outside the Atlantic region return to their Maritime homes.

With icy roads discouraging many drivers from taking long trips and extreme low temperatures cutting down on hitch-hiking, trains will take the bulk of the load of homegoing students.

**HALIFAX AREA**

The Halifax area provides the largest student body in the region with Dalhousie University, St. Mary's University, The University of King's College, the Nova Scotia Technical School, Mount St. Vincent College, Mount St. Vincent Academy and the Halifax School for the Blind School and Edgely School for New Year, allowing their home Mount Allison University to travel by CN.

Holiday travel by students from Acadia University at Wolfville began Wednesday with the university closing down finally on Saturday. Acadia has more than 1,300 registered students. A large number of students are expected to travel from Mount St. Vincent's Collegiate the Halifax School for the Blind and Edgely School for New Year, allowing their home Mount Allison University to travel by CN.

At Antigonish St. Francis Xavier University and Mount St. Bernard College, with a total registration of more than 1,500 closed down Thursday.

total registration of almost 6,000 students to return to their homes for the vacation period. Officials anticipate many hundreds of these students will board trains at Halifax this weekend en route for homes — mainly in the Maritimes — but also in almost every province of Canada.

Hundreds more will be seeking space on the trains at stops along the route. At Truro, the Nova Scotia Teachers' College and the Nova Scotia Agricultural College close down on Friday for the holiday — sending some 700 students on the homeward trek.

The Moncton area will also lose a large stream of students on Friday when St. Joseph's College, the University of Moncton, the New Brunswick Technological College and College Notre Dame d'Acadie all close for the holiday period. Many of the students from these colleges will be bound for northern New Brunswick centres and towns and villages in the Gaspé and other parts of Quebec.

On Prince Edward Island students attending St. Dunstan's University and Prince of Wales College will make use of CN services to reach their homes in time for the Christmas festivities.

Train travel is expected to be the order for the day in Newfoundland as students of Memorial University head for their homes in various areas of Newfoundland via CN.

The outward flow of college students is expected to continue until the Christmas holiday period is in full swing — and by that time CN was preparing to handle the second half of the operation as students start to make their way back to their colleges for the new semester.

The majority of the colleges open on January 4 and railway officials are expecting particularly heavy student movements on January 2 and January 3. The officials pointed out that students' responses to their appeal for early reservations this year had been good. On CN's Ocean Limited, operating between Halifax and Montreal, reservations are required for all space, including coach seats.

## China May Call Own Conference

MOSCOW (AP)—China may call its own meeting of world Communist parties to challenge the authority of the Soviet meeting set for March, informed observers said here.

The charged hint of a Chinese counter-meeting came last Aug. 20 when Peking published a resolution of the New Zealand Communist party, which backs China.

The resolution suggested "a multilateral meeting of those who hold similar views to the Communist party of New Zealand on world ideological issues." It said parties that have shown a reluctance to come to Moscow also should be invited.

Indonesia's Communist party announced Tuesday it would not come to Moscow next March. Counting 18,500,000 Communist party members in China and 2,000,000 in Indonesia, the Chinese have claimed that more than half the world's estimated 42,000,000 Communist members are behind them.

China is backed by Albania, North Korea, North Viet Nam, and the Japanese Communist party in addition to Indonesia.
