

### Indian Rights Study Plan Given Blast

OTTAWA (CP) — Citizenship Minister Nicholson announced Monday a new committee has been set up to study how the ancient hunting and fishing rights of Canadian Indians have been nullified by fish and game laws.

Gene Rheume, D.N.—Northwest Territories and Frank Howard, NDP—Skeena immediately denounced the minister's common statement with complaints that it just means more talk and no action on a subject vital to Indian rights.

Mr. Nicholson said it is apparent Canadian hunting and fishing regulations have failed to safeguard the rights granted to Indians under treaties from King George III.

The committee with representatives from the citizenship external affairs, fisheries, justice and northern affairs departments, would look into the whole complicated matter and suggest legislation to bring the laws in line with treaty promises.

Mr. Rheume said he had listened to the minister "with dismay." The Indians had been waiting for action and all they got was more words.

It was a betrayal of the Indians who had a legal right to hunt fish and trap at any time on unoccupied Crown lands under ancient treaties with the Crown.

He added the announcement obviously had been prompted by a recent British Columbia appeal court ruling upholding the right of two Nanaimo Indians to shoot a deer out of season.

### Course In Mining Engineering To Discontinue

TORONTO (CP) — The University of Toronto will discontinue its undergraduate course in mining engineering—a subject in which only 40 persons graduated in the whole of Canada last year—as soon as the students now enrolled in the four-year course complete their studies.

The university announced that the decision was made on recommendation of the Council of the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering.

The university's statement was released at the same time as a unique course for mining graduates on a tri-university basis was outlined Sunday at the opening of the annual meeting here of the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy.

Prof. C. L. Emery, head of the department of mineral engineering at the University of British Columbia, said Laval University in Quebec City, Queen's University, Kingston, Ont., and UBC will participate in the new program, interchanging staff and students to utilize the features stressed most by the participating universities.

University of Toronto's announcement of dropping of the mining engineering course said the character of the mining industry has changed to become more sophisticated in recent years.

In many cases, it said, the industry's highly specialized needs can no longer be met by graduates from the traditional mining engineering courses.

### Canada Council Scholarship Winners Named

OTTAWA (CP) — The Canada Council announced Monday the 88 recipients of its scholarships and fellowships this year in English and in French language and literature, in other languages and literatures, in linguistics and in the fine arts.

They are among a record 200 students offered pre-doctoral awards in the humanities, the social sciences and the fine arts. The awards average \$2,000 plus travel allowances where applicable and the outlay by the council runs to almost \$560,000 plus \$60,000 for travel. There were 782 applicants.

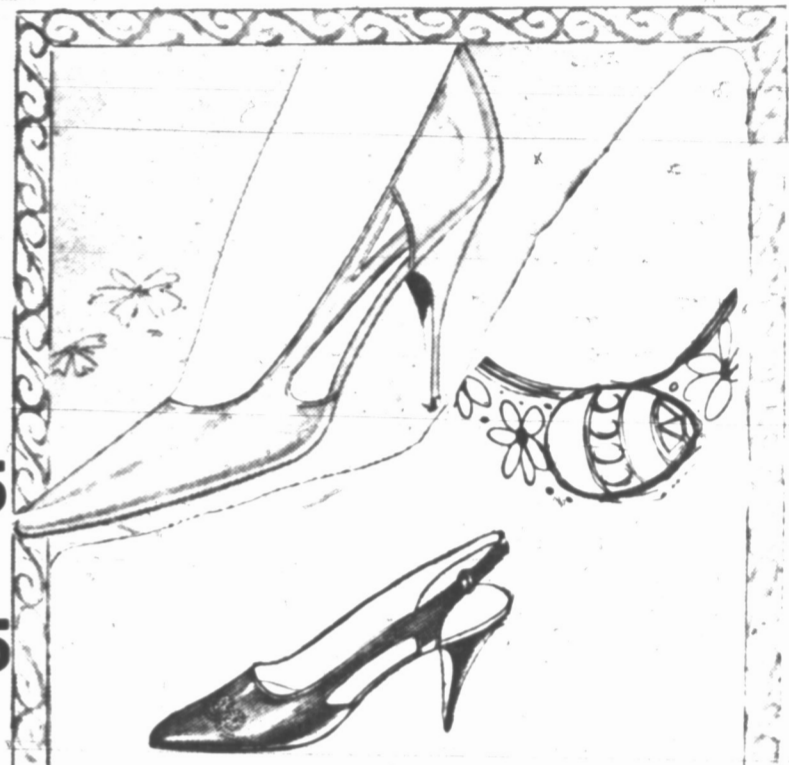

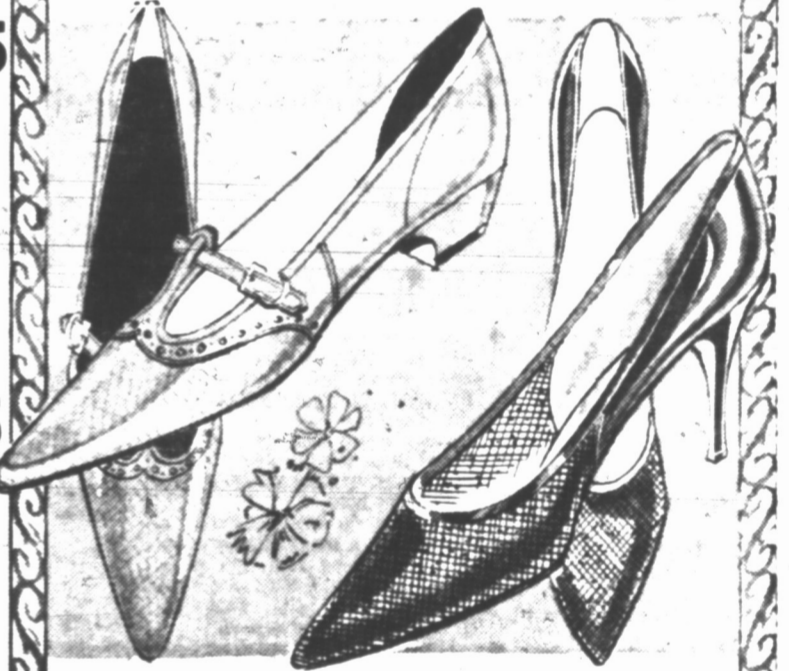

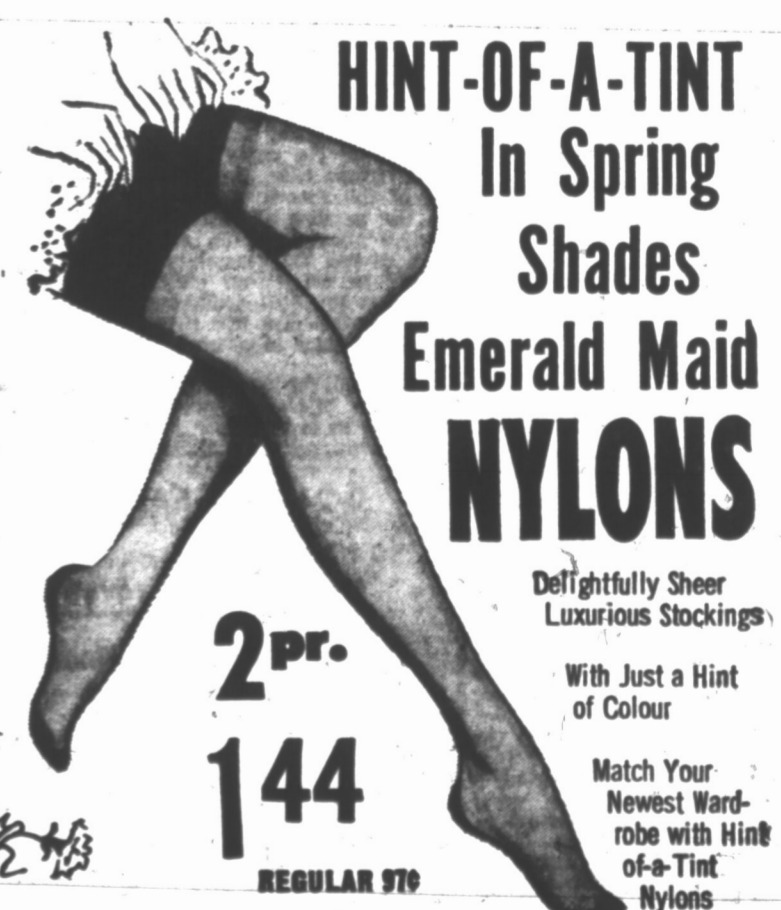
