R.C.A.F. Sees Answer To Subs In Latest Aircraft

By ED SMITH Canadian Press Staff Writer MONTREAL (CP)—The RCAF thinks it has most if not all the answers to enemy submarines—surfaced or submerged. The prize package is the CL-28 reconnaissance bomber now rolling off Canadair Ltd. production lines. Two of the giant electronic monsters now are undergoing tests for flight behavior and equipment action. The results so far have been gratifying.

Built and designed on order for the RCAF's maritime command, the CL-28 or Argus will be flown from bases at Greenwood, N.S., and Summerside, P.E.I. next spring. It is not known how many will be delivered but it has been reported the Argus will add the long-range punch and perception the missing and killing team that already includes the potent Neptune bomber.

Thousands of fish per mile in P.E.I. streams, is report. Thousands of trout per mile have been found on many island streams by fisheries research scientist, the May meeting of the Prince County Fish and Game Association was told last evening by Mr. G. A. C. Wilson, senior biologist with the fish culture group, Department of Fisheries, Saint John, N.B. Mr. Wilson, who spent five years at the biological station at Ellerslie, said that brooks and streams in Prince Edward Island are natural fish hatcheries, conducive to the reproduction of trout by being cold, sheltered, and having plenty of natural food supply. Introduced by Lowell Hancock, Mr. Wilson described several methods of improving trout fishing conditions on island streams by simple installations to provide cover for fish through the use of deflection devices made of logs, sandstone rock, tile, or concrete blocks, to speed up the river current in the area in which they were placed. The faster flow of water would tend to dig out holes on or a channel in this area which would provide shelter for the fish. Low dams also provide similar benefit, but if too high might slow the flow of water allowing it to warm up, and resulting in trout moving to colder water. The ideal temperature for trout ranges from 57 to 68 degrees. Mr. Wilson said that much can be done in stream improvement providing deeper pools, and supplying artificial cover, shade and shelter for fish in barren and shallow areas of streams.
