Dequest For Brewery Sparks Resignations

ALBERTON Councillors Douglas Rix and Vernon Hudson submitted their resignations in writing, as a result of the request of Alberton Town Council last night. The reason was the inclusion in the request for a brewery in the town's brief to the West Prince economic survey hearing recently in Alberton. Council Rix is serving his third term in the town council. He was elected to his first two-year term in January of this year. On Monday the resignations were held over for a month and will come up at the next regular meeting. The police report for August and September listed four cases of intoxication and three juveniles given one-year probation charges of theft. It was approved that the senior citizens housing development be exempted from regular town taxes except for sewerage. Mayor Roy Leard presided and Councillors Gordon, Hardy, MacNeil and McNeil were in attendance.

Souris Dragger Captain Sets Fish Landing Record

Already the holder of a number of records in the fishing industry, Captain Jonas Bjornsson, owner and skipper of the MV Iceland, a Souris dragger, again established another record last Saturday. Capt. Bjornsson, in setting the new record landed his one million pound fish this season. In fact he exceeded his mark by some 46,000 pounds.
