PARENTS SHOULD SET EXAMPLE TO CHILDREN

Everywhere in human life we encounter the fact of authority. No group, from the smallest, the family, to the group of millions in the state, can exist without authority...

We find ourselves prepared all our lives to obey many different people. We learn as children to do first what our parents tell us; later what our teachers tell us; we learn that we must obey the police, but at the same time that other people must obey the policeman when he protects us while we cross the street.

As we grow older, we somehow find authority less sacred, but we still acknowledge its necessity when we obey various civil officials who tell us things we can do and cannot do, and what taxes must be paid to maintain public services.

It is on this change in our attitude to authority that I would like to relect a little today. The readiest example of our changing feeling is, perhaps, that of the policeman. Children have great respect for policemen, and confidence in them. When a policeman takes a child's hand crossing the street the child is full of pride at the tower of strength beside him.

When a policeman takes a child's hand crossing the street the child is full of pride at the tower of strength beside him. The same thing is true of the teachers of small children. There seems to be something sacred about their authority.

INFLUENCED BY ELDERS But as children grow older, even before they are all grown up, they begin to lose this respect for policemen and teachers. This happens partly, of course, because they no longer live in the special, innocent world of youth; but it is by no means just a matter of losing the illusions of childhood in the face of reality. It is not from reality that children get their ideas as they grow up but from their elders, and because most of their

PLAN NEW FRONT FOR ST. PETER'S

The Parishoners of St. Peter's Cathedral held a special meeting on Thursday evening to consider the problem facing them in replacing the brick front of the Cathedral, which has been condemned, and must now be rebuilt. Work on the demolition of the old front, which had already begun in 1924, has already begun by local architect, J. F. Toombs, B.Arch. The estimated cost is \$35,000, which will be a heavy load for the congregation. It was announced at the meeting that

the first contribution received, in the amount of \$1000, was from a non-member. Needless to say this generous donation gave much encouragement and was much appreciated. This church originally had a wooden front, which was replaced by brick in 1924 as a memorial to the late Canon Simp son, M.A., D.C.L., who passed to his reward in 1920, after faithfully serving the congregation of 34. His pastorate was followed by that of Canon E. M. Malone, M.A., D. D., who carried on

the work for 31 years, until his retirement three years ago. Canon Malone will celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood in February 1936, and it was decided to designate the necessary building fund in his honor as "The Canon Malone Jubilee Building Fund." Defects in the old front began to appear some years ago, which necessitated considerable repairs. During the last few years it became apparent that more would have to be done, and this summer engineers advised that unless it were torn down and

replaced it would become dangerous after exposed to another winter's weather. A rebuilding fund committee was appointed by the meeting, headed by Mr. John O. Hyndman as Honorary Chairman, with Col. J. R. Paton, Chairman, with George Michael, F. W. Hyndman, F. S. Carbone and Brig. G. G. K. Peake as Committee members. The tender of County Construction Co. Ltd. was accepted for the reconstruction and the campaign to raise the necessary funds will soon be under way.
