NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The "dry season" began to-day! —St. John Sun: The Republican convention in the United States has an unusual allowance of party capital this year.

The Montreal Gazette points out that the Liberal papers, in anticipation of a general election and the revision of the voters' lists, are urging that party candidates should be put in the field.

It is evident that times are not improving in the United States. The postmaster of Buffalo, N. Y., has over nine hundred families on his books receiving relief, and in New York city, a few days ago, two respectable dressed men walked up and down Broadway with placards hanging about their necks notifying the public that they "wanted work."

It is also admitted that the number of Japanese residents in the Korean peninsula is at least six times greater than that of the Chinese sojourners, while the volume of Japan's trade with Korea exceeds that of China's trade with the same kingdom in an even larger proportion.

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THE KOREAN TROUBLE.

The New York Sun gives a summary of its understanding of the Korean dispute. Condensed it is as follows: Japan has proceeded strictly within the limits of her treaty rights, where these have been ignored by China. Those rights are defined in the Tientsin convention of 1885.

What happened in the present case? Soon after the outbreak of the present rebellion, China dispatched a body of soldiers to the Korean peninsula, but it was not until the troops were actually on the peninsula that China notified Japan that it had determined to render assistance to the tributary State.

Monday a very splendid wedding ceremony was presided by Rev. W. L. Clay, at the residence of Mr. Henry Lawson, editor of the Colonist, 76 Cook Street.

WASHINGTON, July 26.—The treasury lost to-day \$2,300,000 in gold; two millions at New York for European export, \$1,000,000 at Boston for European export and \$2,000,000 at New York for shipment to Canada.

WASHINGTON, July 26.—The subcommittee of the committee on emigration, which had charge of Rev. Mr. Lawson's bill to protect American labor on the borders, reported it favorably to the full committee to-day with several changes.

NEW YORK, July 26.—The police board this evening found Capt. Doherty and ex-wardmen Mehan and Hock guilty of having received money for police protection, and dismissed them from the force.

MANCHESTER, July 26.—An international conference of the textile workers to-day, Mr. Howard, an American, presiding, it was resolved to invite the governments of Europe and America to adopt measures legalizing eight hours a day's labor.
