IN MEMORIAM

WILLIAM W. BROWN

The funeral of William Brown was held from his residence, Elmwood, N. S., on Monday afternoon with Rev. M. Hamilton officiating assisted by Rev. N. Jost. Interment followed at Greenwood Cemetery, Pictou Landing. At the graveside, the Eastern Star Lodge of Pictou, conducted the service. Mr. Brown, a resident of Elmwood, died on March 9th, 1956, he was a retired station agent, born April 5th, 1874, at Mayfield, P. E. I. the son of John W. Brown and his wife Agnes Smith. After receiving a rudimentary education in the public school of his native district, he studied telegraphy, under the tutelage of the late Daniel Mackinnon, at Hunter River, R. S. Station. Subsequently he became a station agent and served in this capacity at the following places in Nova Scotia: West Bay Road, Hilden, North Sydney, Pictou Landing, Elmsdale and Tatamagouche. In the age of 65, he retired from active service, with an honorable and efficient record of duty well done.

In 1903 he was united in marriage with Barbara MacLachlan, daughter of the late Allan and Mrs. MacLachlan of West Bay Road, who with a family of four daughters and two grandchildren mourn his passing. They are Ena (Mrs. Ernest G. Smith) and Miss Jean Brown of Elmsdale; Marjorie, dietician V. G. Hospital, Halifax; Donald, Mrs. Kenneth Fraser of Pictou Landing; Master Robert MacGregor Fraser and his sister, Margaret Fraser; also one brother, Dr. W. I. Brown and two sisters, Mrs. Gordon Laird and Miss Marjorie Brown of New Glasgow, P. E. I. Another sister, Agnes, (Mrs. E. C. Rollings) predeceased him. The late Mr. Brown had been in apparent good health until the morning of his death when he had a heart seizure and passed away suddenly. He was a strong supporter of all efforts in behalf of Christian advancement, and took a great interest, as a member of the Independent Order of Oddfellows.
