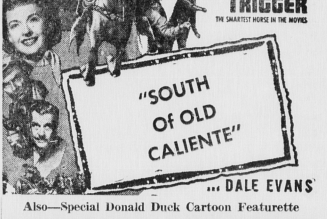
The second school was held Tuesday in St. Peter's School in St. Peter's Bay and was for members of the credit union board of directors.
