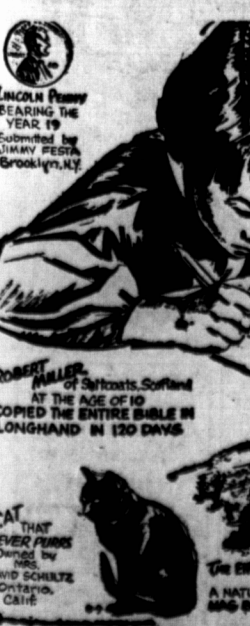

RAY ATHERTON Friends and neighbors of the late Ray Atherton, Mount Herbert, P.E.I., were shocked at his sudden passing on Sunday evening July 14th, at the Prince Edward Island Hospital. Stricken that morning while at breakfast, he succumbed to a cerebral hemorrhage without regaining consciousness.

His jovial smile and witty remarks will ever be missed by those who knew him.

Born 56 years ago at Arlington Mass., U.S.A. he moved to Mt. Herbert at the early age of fifteen. He was the only son of Alvin Atherton and Abigail MacWilliams of West Cape, P.E.I., both parents having predeceased him many years ago.

Those who mourn are his sorrowing wife, the former Minnie Sherren of Crapaud and one son

Walter, now in Malden, Mass., and a sister Mary Atherton Mansor of Los Angeles, California.

The funeral was held from the MacLean Funeral Home and was very largely attended. The Rev. G. R. F. Ebsary officiated and burial was in St. John's Anglican cemetery, Crapaud. Hymns sung were: "Unto The Hills Around," and "The Lord's My Shepherd."

IN MEMORIAM

SAMUEL C. G. MacNEILL The death occurred at New Dominion on June 15th, 1957, of Samuel C. G. MacNeill in his 78th year.

Although not enjoying good health for a number of years, he was able to be about, until September, 1956, when he suffered a fall, resulting in a badly fractured hip, which necessitated hospitalization. After a time he returned home, where he was confined to bed except for short intervals, spent in a wheel chair each day. Early in May he contracted congestion and although for a time he seemed to rally, his strength gradually failed until on the above date he quietly passed away.

The late Mr. MacNeill was born in New Dominion, son of the late Donald D. and Catherine MacNeill and was the last surviving member of a family of eleven children. At an early age he moved with his family to Nine Mile Creek where he spent most of his life as a farmer until in 1948, due to ill health, he was forced to retire.

Being possessed of a quiet, but friendly nature, he was always ready to lend a helping hand to any one who might need his assistance. He was greatly interested in political affairs, and was always a staunch supporter of the Liberal party. He was an adherent of New Dominion United Church, and as long as health permitted he was a regular attendant at the services.

His wife the former Harriet Sophia Gorveast of Cumberland, predeceased him in September, 1949.

He leaves to cherish his memory, two daughters, (Katherine), Mrs. Thomas Lowther, New Dominion, with whom he resided since the death of his wife, and (Georgetta), Mrs. Milton MacNevin, Canoe Cove, also five grand-children, Sterling, Marion, Lloyd, Evelyn and Laurina MacNevin.

The tragic death of a sixth grandchild Nancy Irene Lowther in 1952 was indeed a very severe blow to a kind and loving grandfather.

The funeral was held on Monday afternoon June 17th, with a short service at the home, followed by service in New Dominion United Church, conducted by his beloved pastor, Rev. J. A. Patterson.
