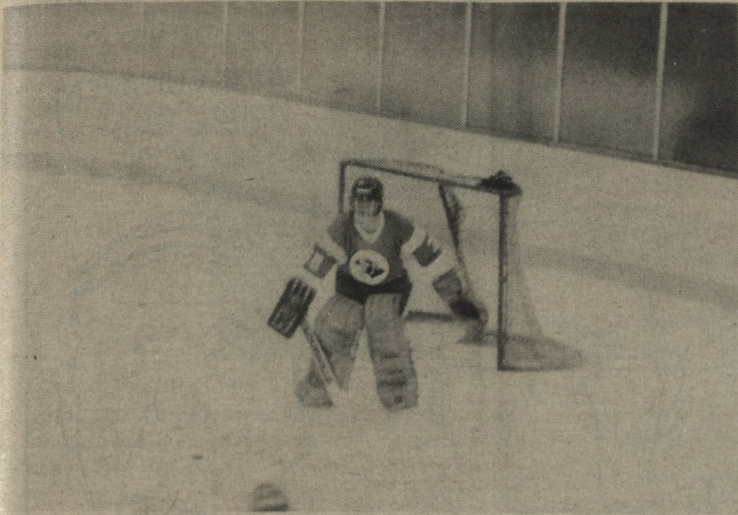


Varsity Sports Report

Volleyball Panthers

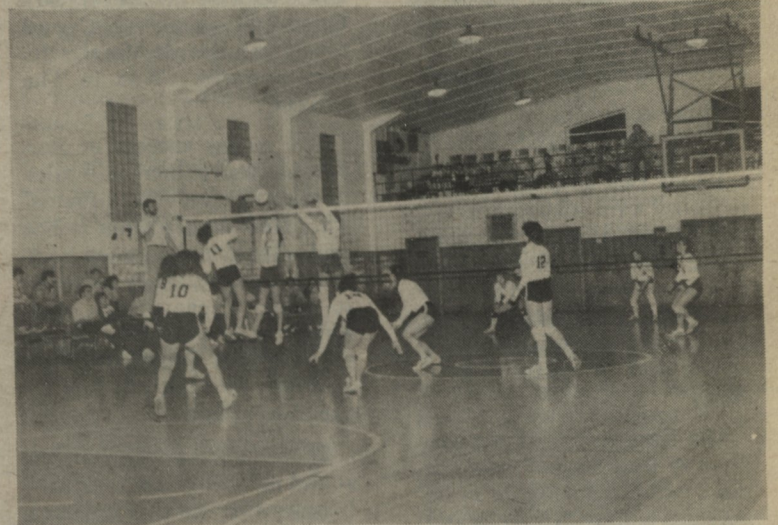

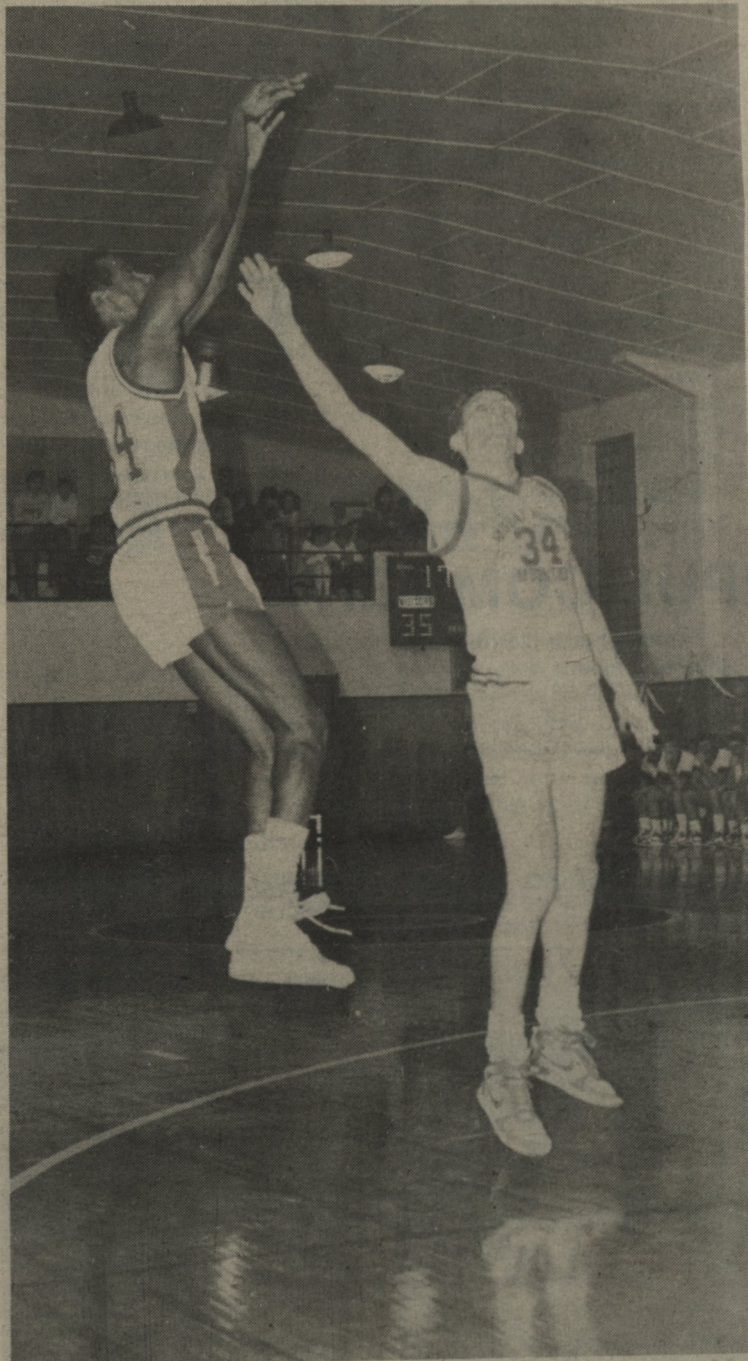
The Lady Panthers Basket-
