By Thursday night August 8, champions will have been crowned in junior, intermediate and senior ranks. Miss Lobbes, Lunenburg, defending champion will not be around to try to cling to her title. Miss Lobbes is in Florida and according to reports she is playing some pretty fair golf there. However, tournament officials were delighted to learn that they may Mary Ellen Driscoll, Robbsey, N.B. will be among the competitors. ### An Interesting Tourney

THE four-day meet shapes up like an interesting one. Monday will see the 18-hole qualifying round. In this round a Maritime women title will be chosen. The junior sporting the lowest score in this qualifying round automatically become Maritime junior champion. Also on Monday a team championship will be decided. The team prize goes to the province with the best score for its four top golfers. The first and second rounds of championship and all rights will be played and on Wednesday the affair gets narrowed to the semi-final. On Thursday a 36-hole championship will go, 18 holes in the morning and another 18 in the afternoon. Also on Thursday afternoon there will be 18 holes medal play in which the competition will be open to all other players eliminated from match. Eligible for senior competition are all women golfers over 45 years of age. The schedule for their championship through 36 holes of medal play, the first 18 on Tuesday and the final 18 on Wednesday. All play in the intermediate bracket is match play.

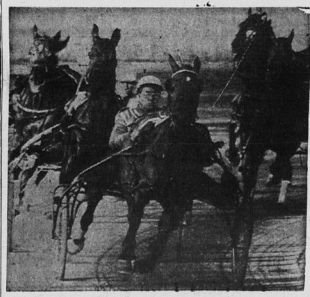
