SPECIAL DESPATCHES TO THE EXAMINER. Labor Troubles in England. Rioting at Bradford. LONDON, April 15. Lister & Co., prominent mill owners, of Bradford, have positively refused to refer the matters in dispute between them and their employes to arbitration, claiming that they have a right to conduct their own business in their own way without outside dictation. Rioting was renewed last evening, and at least 20,000 persons were involved in the melee. The street lamps were extinguished by the rioters. The military police and special constables charged and dispersed the mob. Many persons were injured.

NEWFOUNDLAND.

PASSAGE OF THE MODUS VIVENDI. LONDON, April 15. In the House of Lords yesterday Lord Knutsford, Secretary of State for the Colonial Department, announced that the bill in regard to the modus vivendi in Newfoundland would come up for a second reading on Monday next, adding that the views of the delegates from Newfoundland, now in this city, will be heard at the bar of the House of Lords if they so desired.

Liberal Leadership in the Lords.

LONDON, April 15. At a meeting of members of the House of Lords who comprise the Liberal party in that body, held yesterday, the Earl of Kimberley was chosen to succeed pro tem Earl Granville as Liberal leader in the House of Lords. Earl of Kimberley will be assisted in the leadership by Earl Spencer and Earl of Rosebury.

LONDON, April 15. Post Office authorities announce that the contract with the Allan Steamship Company for carrying the Canadian Mails has expired. Henceforth the Canadian mails will go to New York via. Queenstown instead via. Londonderry.

LONDON, April 15. The Welsh tinplaters will close their works for one month from July 1st, being forced to restrict their output in consequence of the new American tariff laws.
