Bank Will Honor 4-H Members

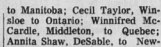

Judgment In Impaired Case Is Deferred By Magistrate

Evidence on a charge of driving while impaired was completed yesterday in the case of Donald Lewis Brehaut. Sherwood, and the accused was remanded until July 22 for judgment by Magistrate James B. Johnston, Q.C. in Queens County magistrate's court.

JUNE ACCIDENTS
Statistics released this morning by the provincial motor vehicle branch show that in May there were 82 motor vehicle accidents in the province. One person was killed, 32 were injured and property damage was estimated at \$5,886. In May 1962, there were 72 accidents, no fatalities, 19 persons injured and property damage was estimated at \$20,985.
