John Taintor Foote, famous author of horse stories, wrote and produced the film for Mr. Frank Foote spent more than three years in research to develop his script from first-hand knowledge gained by viewing old films showing races and exhibition miles paced by the wonder horse, Dan Patch. He also had access to material filed by M. W. Savage estate, which owned the horse.

The executive producer of the picture, W. R. Frank, comes from Minnesota, and is a longtime friend of the Savage family, who are also Minnesotans. Frank's first love for Dan Patch began in 1905, when he saw the horse pace the mile at the Minnesota State Fair in 1.55. In the intervening years, Frank grew up to become a prominent motion picture exhibitor and distributor, and when he came to Hollywood seven years ago his major project was to produce a picture based on the career of the famed pacer.

Impersonating the great Dan Patch on the screen is another wonder horse called Visalia Abbe, which was discovered on the Craig Cimarron Ranch near Phoenix, Arizona. With the exception of the crooked hind legs, identification mark of Patch, Visalia Abbe resembles his famous predecessor almost minutely.

The John Taintor Foote script covers the life and times of Dan Patch from the time he was foaled by Zelica, and carries Patch through his career until his last exhibition mile in Los Angeles in 1910.
