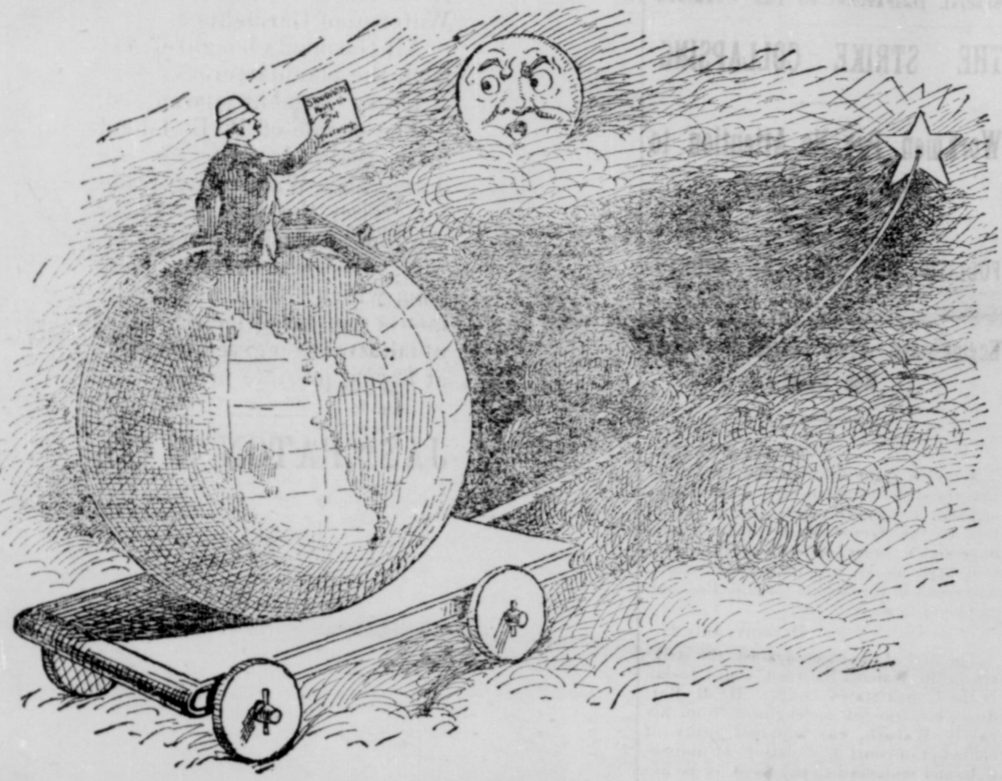

PETTY POLITICS.
