On July 27, 1953, I brought a man before the Stipendiary Magistrate for Queen's County at Charlottetown, charged under the Special Fishery Regulations in that he did fish for trout by other means than angling—in other words "jiggering". He pleaded "not guilty" and was represented by Lester P. O'Donnell, Charlottetown lawyer. A brief outline of my evidence as follows: "Found defendant standing within 10 feet of a noted trout pool. His hip rubber boots were wet within two inches of the top. On the bank of the pool I picked up a 'jig'. The cod line attached to a length of alder was wet, also the tip of the alder. He offered no explanation except that he was looking at two men in the brook who were strangers. When pressed for an explanation he replied: 'You can go to H—' and walked away."

house was boarded up with hay and grass growing as high as the window sills. Mrs. Jones and her daughter were living in Ontario at the time. Also he had a lame excuse when asked why his boots would be wet within two inches of their tops when the water in front of the engine was a bare 12 or 14 inches deep—whereas the water in the trout pool was 3 feet deep. His boots rolled down. In that case they'd have been wet inside and out. The Magistrate didn't believe his story and he was convicted as charged.

Counsel for defence appealed from the sentence imposed. On October 13, 1953, the appeal was heard before Chief Justice Mark R. McGuigan in the Supreme Court at Charlottetown. The conviction was quashed and \$35 costs allowed. No counsel was appointed by the department concerned and the burden of prosecution fell on my shoulders. The Regional Supervisor of Fisheries, Charlottetown, was immediately made acquainted with the facts and advised that two extra copies of the judge's report on the case, one for the Halifax office and the other for head office at Ottawa. After three weeks had elapsed without any reply I inquired at the local office of Fisheries in Charlottetown and was informed: "No word yet". A few days later Mr. O'Donnell stuck his head in the office where I work when I'm not in the woods and with that wide, open faced smile he sometimes sports, inquired about any word from Ottawa. I replied: "No word yet" and explained the steps I had taken. A few days later, on December

9 to be exact, without any advance warning, the County Sheriff called at my home and served an execution on me for \$40.15... lot of other doo-dads neatly itemized. I paid up. No use bucking the tiger. I am not relating this to seek sympathy. I know I'll be reimbursed in due course but I want to show honest sportsmen how the wind is blowing. There is an element abroad

that is opposed to law and order with a special grudge against game law enforcement. Once they find out they can get away with something they'll pile it on thick. Remember boys, the lobster industry is sick, so sick that it's a toss up how many years will pass before the pine box is ordered. Do you want your sport of trout fishing to go the same way? The answer is up to you.

How much real support have you given over the years to help protect your own interests? Whether you know it or not there is a "squeeze play" on, instituted by the poaching element and those who do not appreciate having their style cramped. What does 1954 and succeeding years hold for honest trout fishermen? The answer is up to you.

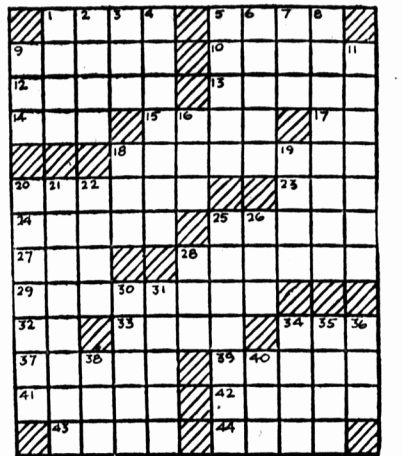
