Queens Liberals Plan Convention For Oct 12

Queens County Liberals will hold a federal nominating convention here on Friday, Oct. 12. It was learned recently yesterday, and Allison Gillis and Ira Lewis are each favored to be named as candidates. The convention will be held in the Community Centre.
County president Harry W. MacLennan is expected to be available for official comment, but the Oct. 12 date was learned from a prominent member of the county executive.
It was learned that Prince County Liberals are moving to hold their county convention as soon as possible, and Albany's George Mackay said yesterday that he will very likely be a candidate. "An acclamation is more likely for the former provincial minister of highways, if he offers."
No date has been suggested yet for the Prince County convention.
Mr. Gillis, a Charlottetown lawyer after a while, and he believes that Ira Lewis, York his partner in the June 18 battle, will offer again.
The county executive spokesman said that no outside speaker will be brought in for the convention.
