BURGLARIES LAST NIGHT.

Newson's and Sanderson's Store Entered—A New Imperial Wheel Missing.

Two burglaries were perpetrated in this city during last night. The stores entered were those of Sanderson & Co., and John Newson, which adjoin each other on the South Side of Queen Square.

The store of Sanderson & Co., was first attacked. A hatchway in the rear was partly forced open, and in this way the cellar was entered. From the cellar the store was reached, and the rear door opened. It looks as if a small boy got in through the opening in the hatchway and going up through the shop opened the door for those who were with him. The store was pretty well examined, but nothing is missing except about a dollar in cash that was taken from the register and some old coins that were in one of the drawers.

From Sanderson's & Co's. the burglars turned their attention to Newson's, and were soon in there searching the premises. Mr. Newson's desk in his private office was thoroughly ransacked, and some postage stamps and cents were taken from a box in one of the drawers. Burnt matches were strewn about the desk and elsewhere around the premises. Before they left the burglars captured a new Imperial bicycle valued at \$100 which was on exhibition in the show-room in the front of the building.

Some of the merchants in the vicinity think it strange that these robberies could have been committed with a night watchman on the block. But the burglars evidently kept an eye on the watchman's movements.

The burglars were reported to the police as soon as they were discovered, and it is hoped that the guilty individuals will be brought to justice at an early date.
