WINNIPEG, May 9 — (CP) — Prices of coarse grain futures were irregular and showed an easier tone in dull trading today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.

The market reflected hesitation in U.S. grain and other commodity markets. Commercial demand was limited to a few shipping orders in oats and barley with some seaboard demand in flax.

Outside reports said a cargo of Canadian wheat was sold to Portugal overnight. Overnight loadings of Canadian wheat for export included 415,000 bushels for the United Kingdom and 265,000 bushels for Belgium.

Prices of class two and I.W.A. wheat were up 1/2 of a cent. Closing prices: Oats — May 82 1/2¢; Jly 79 1/2¢; Oct. 80. Barley — May 1.18; Jly 1.16 1/2¢; Oct. 1.16. Rye — May 1.85 1/2¢; Jly 1.85 1/2¢; Oct. 1.80 1/2¢. Flax — May 3.83 1/2¢; Jly 3.84 1/2¢; Oct. 3.80 1/2¢.

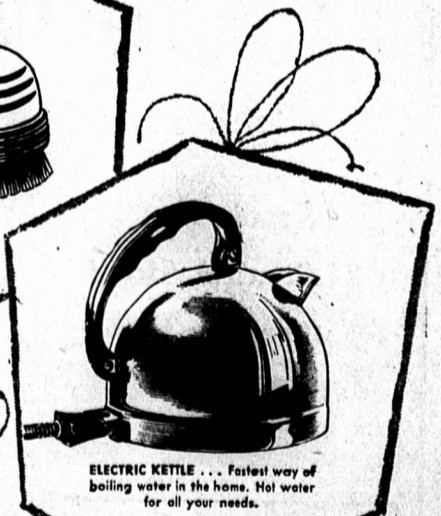
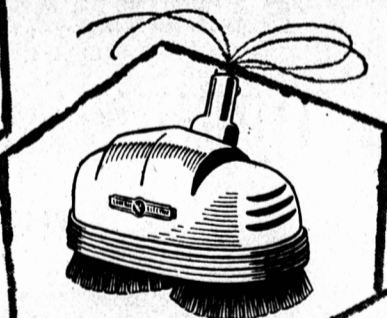
