.S. Atomic Submarine Disappeared During Deep Diving Trials

Daylight Time Slated For P.E.I. This Year

For the first time since 1947, at least, Daylight Saving Time will be observed in Prince Edward Island this summer.

Premier Walter R. Shaw announced in the Legislature yesterday that the province will have Daylight Saving Time.

His announcement was greeted with a applause and desk thumping by the Liberal opposition.

"Now I can put my watch on legal time," said Opposition Leader A.W. Matheson.

SAME AS MAINLAND

The premier said later that a Daylight Saving Time will be observed here when most of the rest of Canada goes on the time, likely from April 27 to Oct. 26.

In 1947, the provincial legislature passed the Time Uniformity Act which stated that there should be "one standard uniform time" in use throughout the province and unless altered by order-in-council, the official time shall be standard time. Provision is made in the act, however, for the government, by order-in-council, to institute Daylight Saving Time.

No government since 1947 has passed such an order-in-council on this year.

During the past few years, while other provinces were on Daylight Saving Time, the province has been on standard time. Provision is made in the act, however, for the government, by order-in-council, to institute Daylight Saving Time.

The navy appeared to be convinced, 12 hours after the Thresher last reported, (9 a.m. Wednesday) that the submarine had flied to surface again.

The admiral said, to another inquiry, that there was "absolutely no chance of nuclear explosion in the submarine, nor is there any danger of radioactive contamination" to shipping.

Anderson said further: "At this moment we are pessimistic. However, there does hope that this is a communications failure."

He noted that the area where the submarine was reported missing had a depth of 8,400 feet.

"Obviously, 8,400 feet is extremely deep and precludes any possibility of salvage if the submarine, indeed, is missing," the admiral said.

At that depth a submarine hull—even that of an atomic sub—would be crushed by the extreme pressure or hitting would be breached, allowing water to pour in.

Lieut.-Governor Hyndman Bids Farewell To Members

Speculation flared anew here yesterday afternoon when His Honour Lieutenant-Governor F. Walter Hyndman made a trip to the members of the Legislature in an informal speech. He observed it would be the last time he would have the opportunity of greeting them informally in his present capacity, though he might or might not still be in office to promote the law, he generally expected within two weeks time, although it could be longer.

His Honour spoke to the members briefly after he had completed the formal duty in the Confederation Chamber of accepting the address in reply to the Speech from the Throne.

Prior to Monday's election observers here were virtually unanimous in their belief that a Liberal would be chosen for the office, as he is now expected to do perhaps some time next week. However, there still were some suggestions Mr. Shaw will be the man who will be the next Government House occupant.

A check yesterday with the Prime Minister's office brought the comment that nothing had been heard of an appointment of a new Lieutenant-Governor.
