

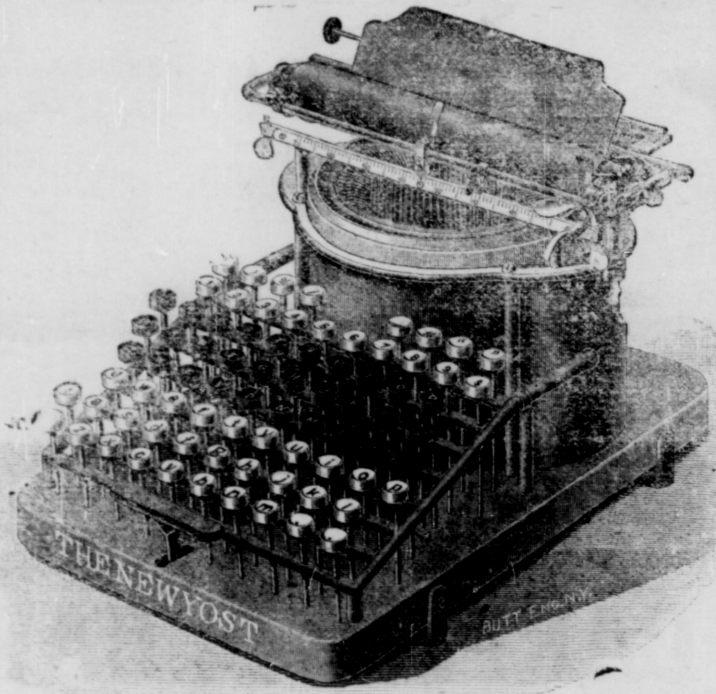

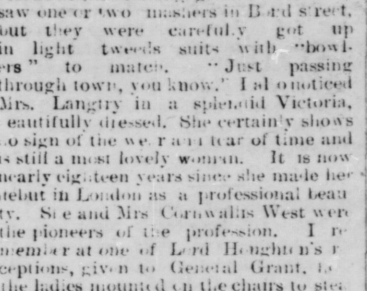

ENGLISHWOMEN WHO DRESS WELL AND ARE BEAUTIFUL.

"Just passing through town," was how I understood Mrs. Langtry in a splendid Victoria, beautifully dressed. She certainly shows a sign of the new fashion of time and is a most lovely woman. It is nearly twenty years since she made her debut in London as a professional beauty. She and Mrs. Cornwallis West were the partners of the profession. I remember at one of Lord Hugh's receptions, given to General Grant, to the ladies mounted on the chairs to sit.

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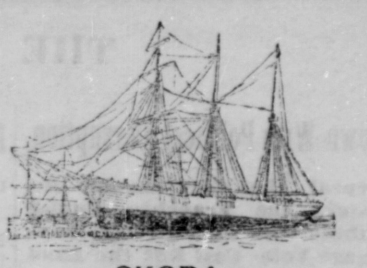
