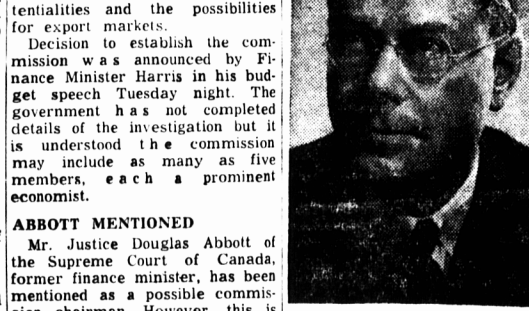

ST. JOHN'S (CP)—The Dominion weather office here says there was nothing spring-like about Wednesday's weather.

Afternoon temperatures were as low as 32, and snow falls in nearly all parts of the Maritimes. The snow changed to rain during the evening in western Nova Scotia and most of New Brunswick.

The same weather sequence is forecast for the eastern regions. Following the disturbance, drier air will return to the district and slowly improving weather is forecast for today.

Regional forecasts: Northern Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island: Cloudy with scattered showers, clearing in the evening; milder; south winds 20 shifting in the afternoon to northwest 20. High at Charlottetown 48 and 45.

Eastern N.B. counties, lower St. John's river valley: Showers, clearing in the afternoon; very mild, but turning colder during morning; northwinds 25. High at Moncton, Fredericton and Saint John 40 and 45.

Upper St. John's river valley, Bay of Chaleur: Cloudy with scattered snowflurries; very mild, but turning colder during morning; northwinds 25. High at Edmundston and Campbellton 38 and 40.
