THE SUMMERSIDE ELECTION.

(From our own Correspondent.)

LAST Wednesday, 31st ultimo, the High Sheriff of Prince County held his Court at St. Eleanor's for the purpose of choosing a fit and proper candidate to represent the Fifth Electoral District of Prince County in the Local Legislature.

Hon. J. C. Pope, in company with many of his friends, and some others, being present, David Rogers, Esq., moved that he be nominated. John Gillis, Esq., of Miscouche seconded the motion.

No other candidate coming forward, Mr. Pope embraced the opportunity of giving an address to the assembled audience. He said that we should not think too lightly of our local politics; but appoint persons of intelligence to act for us in Parliament; that we had been financially imposed upon by the Mackenzie Government in Ottawa; not a single dollar was laid out in this Colony for our wharves, light-houses, &c., that Laird and others do not represent us as they should, and we had to suffer in consequence. On the school question he had been misrepresented by his enemies. Whenever the subject came up in proper form, he would not shrink from the thing and play double, as Laird did at Ottawa; but there was no danger at present. It must be settled by the people themselves. Until that was done he should not touch it nor vote on it. He thought it very wrong, in a mixed community as this is, to introduce such things as tend to set Protestant against Catholic, and vice versa.

At four o'clock, p. m., the Sheriff brought the nomination to a close, and declared Hon. J. C. Pope duly elected.

Mr. Pope, in a neat speech, thanked his friends for the interest they had taken in his welfare, and trusted that they would not be deceived in him. He thanked his opponents for not giving a factious opposition, which could result in no good. Three cheers were then given for Mr. Pope, and the assembly dispersed.
