Canadian-Born Doctor Saves U.S. From Suspected Pills

WASHINGTON (CPA) Canadian-born doctor is credited with having stubbornly blocked marketing in the U.S. of the first Canadian-made suspected of having caused thousands of malformed babies in Europe—and now in Canada as well.
She is Dr. Frances Oldham Kelsey, a federal Food and Drug Administration medical officer who refused to be hurried into approving the drug for sale in the U.S. despite the fact, as the potential manufacturer pointed out, the sedative had been approved for sale in West Germany, Britain, Canada and other countries.

Dr. Kelsey, a native of Vancouver Island, said she was not entirely convinced that the drug was safe.
Sunday's Washington Post gave this account of the episode.
In September 1960, Dr. Kelsey received from the Willam S. Merrell Company of Cincinnati a request for permission to market the drug, Merrell sold it in the same Keovadon.

DECLINES LICENSE
Dr. Kelsey declined to license it and for the next year kept issuing 60-day postponements whenever the application was returned to her. Finally, in November 1961, Merrell received a cable from Europe indicating that thalidomide was linked with malformations in babies born to women who had used the drug.

The firm reported this promptly to Dr. Kelsey and withdrew the licensing application.
Subsequent investigations, conducted by West German officials, established a link between thalidomide and phocomelia, a fatal malformation that results in leaves its victims with only one normal arm, the other side having rudimentary finger-like stumps from a stub below the shoulder.
It is estimated that as the end of next month the number of such drug-induced malformations will total between 3,500 and 4,000 in West Germany alone. About two out of three of the afflicted babies survive.

DRUG WITHDRAWN
Thalidomide—under its various trade names—now has been generally withdrawn from the market.
Winton B. Rankin, assistant commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration, said of Dr. Kelsey:
"The American public owes her a vote of thanks."

Dr. Kelsey, who lives in suburban Chevy Chase, Md., with her husband and two daughters, said she was not given the right in her determination not to license the drug until convinced of its safety.
But she recognizes that if the drug had proven to be as safe as the applicant had promised, she believed "I would have been considered unreasonable."

EDUCATED IN VICTORIA
One of a family of four children, she was born to a British artillery officer who settled just north of Victoria. Dr. Kelsey was educated in Victoria and later graduated from McGill University in science, specializing in pharmacology. She got her doctor's degree in pharmacology at the
