Co-Pilot Had Premonition

MONTREAL (CP) — Co-pilot Paul Renaud, 27, of Montreal, was making his last flight with Maritime Central Airways aboard the DC-4 which crashed at Issoudun, Que., Sunday with a loss of 79 lives.

His brother, Pierre, said he had an application into Trans-Canada Air Lines and Pan-American for a new job.

Pierre, a former RCAF pilot, said Paul had "some sort of strange feeling" about the flight, "some premonition, I think."

"When I heard the plane was missing, I knew right away that was the plane Paul was on."

"He was the kind of person that we never saw very much of. But before this trip, he suddenly came here and visited everybody in the family — my mother, my sister, and cousins, people he never saw regularly or wrote to. I think he had some sort of feeling that something was going to happen."

The co-pilot leaves a wife and two children. The family lived in Montreal, N.B.

Builds His Own Car Museum
IONA, Ont. (CP)—Fred Hurst, a mechanic with an interest in old-time automobiles, is building a car museum — one of the first in Ontario.

In fact, some of his neighbors in this village 11 miles southwest of St. Thomas are so enthused about the project that the men in the area have staged several "bees" to speed completion of the hangar-like structure.

"They want to hold a dance in it the night before we move in the cars," explained Fred with a grin.

All the cars will be rebuilt as much as possible.

An eye-catcher to young and old alike will undoubtedly be a 1914 fire truck used in London, Ont. A 1918 model Hart-Parr farm tractor, representing mechanization in the agricultural field, will also be on exhibit.

Undergoing repairs is a natty 1904 Kennedy which appears to have been made in Stratford, Ont. Solid carriage wheels and a buggy chassis show that the designer considered the vehicle a true horseless carriage.

It also carried unnecessary but nice paraphernalia. Sporting an air-cooled engine, the Kennedy has a dummy radiator with a flashy brass trim. The radiator won't hold a drop of water.

The newest exhibit is likely to be a 1929 Nash. The car, almost factory new, has just completed 700 miles of highway driving in top shape.
