TORONTO (CP)—Canadian construction contracts in the first seven months of this year reached a record total of \$1,996,592,100, or \$38,977,400 more than in the same period last year, says Hugh C. MacLean of Building Reports. Figures by categories were: Residential \$707,792,100, up \$38,997,000; business \$443,388,400, up \$39,560,200; industrial \$298,204,300, up \$133,537,500; engineering \$546,137,500, up \$174,688,700. July figures by regions were: Atlantic \$17,500,000, up \$3,400,000; Quebec \$89,800,000, up \$30,900,000; West 145,300,000, up \$77,700,000. Big jobs included: Atlantic mill buildings, Newcastle, N.B., \$5,000,000. Quebec—two seaway-lock contracts, Beauharnois, \$25,500,000; Aluminum development townsite, Baie Comeau, \$15,000,000. N.S.
