FREDERICTON (CP) — The New Brunswick legislature ended a six-week spring session with a hotly contested and perhaps the biggest question in the minds of both members and the public.

The Liberal government of Premier Louis J. Robichaud wants more study of the radical proposals of a royal commission on municipal finance and taxation and a second session to discuss the report was scheduled for later in the year.
