

The Soudan.

A great many people are at present puzzled over the "Soudan," of which they hear so much. They are not quite sure if it would betray an unpardonable amount of ignorance for them to confess to a general kind of unacquaintance with what this Soudan is and how far it extends. Would it give these people—who, by the way, need not be ashamed to confess their ignorance—any kind of satisfactory information to tell them that Soudan is the name given by the Egyptians to all their dependent empire stretching from the Third Cataract for an indefinite distance toward the lakes, and from the Red Sea to the western border of Darfur? This empire comprises much of Nubia, all Sennaar, all Kordofan, and all Darfur. It is said to be about 1,000 miles square, or as large as India. This vast extent of a million of square miles is said to be inhabited by about 12,000,000 people, most of them Mussulmans, and many of these of exceptional ferocity, fanaticism, and daring. Eventually, it seems likely, the English will have to tackle with this wild, ferocious crowd, if at any rate it invade Egypt, which is far from unlikely. Toronto Globe.

The Duke of Edinburgh's Farm.

It is perfectly true, as reported some time ago, that the Duke of Edinburgh was going in for agricultural pursuits. Very heartily, too, does he seem to have done so. He has entered into possession of the greater part of a park of over 25,000 acres—the second largest in England. 14,000 acres, however, is all the Duke is able at present to manipulate: of these 460 acres are brake and woodland, and of the remaining 940 acres about three-fourths is pasture. The park absolutely swarms with deer, but these are to be reduced to 500. The Duke hopes to go in largely for the purest breeds of sheep and cattle; 900 Southdown are to be kept in the best possible condition; 40 Scotch cattle ditto. Then there is a Jersey bull of the best procurable blood as also Jersey heifers equally pure. If the Duke does nothing more, he may be sure of prizes at Islington. At all events the farmers may congratulate themselves that one more establishment is in working order for breeding from the best known stocks. One of the cart horses is an old charger and saw service in the Russian war.

Matthew Arnold is reported to have terribly shocked a Boston audience by its reference to "great, intelligent, sensual, avaricious America." An outburst of warm dissent promptly found expression on every side, but the growing indignation of the aggrieved audience was immediately checked in a somewhat humiliating and ludicrous manner by the calm, unhurried explanation of the lecturer, that the objectionable language was not his, but was borrowed from one of Emerson's letters to Carlyle.

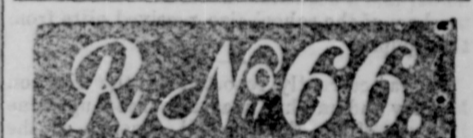
