**Audio-Visual Aids Urged For Education In Quebec**

VANCOUVER (CP)—Pierre Juneau, executive director of the National Film Board, said Wednesday the Quebec government should start a library of audio-visual aids for the province's schools.

He made the suggestion in an address to l'Association Canadienne des Educateurs de Langue Francaise. Some 600 French-speaking educationists from all parts of Canada are attending the group's four-day annual meeting.

Mr. Juneau said most other provinces already have such lending libraries in operation and Quebec could design itself a model organization by drawing on their experience.

One problem was the cost involved if Quebec decided to make its own educational films on their experience.

To avoid prohibitive expense, the province could either draw on the resources of other countries or try to work out a co-operative program with other provinces.

**GERMANS SHARE COST**

In Germany, where education also was a provincial responsibility, the provinces had formed an interprovincial organization to share the cost of educational films.

This organization was helped by grants from the German federal government and private industry.

Mr. Juneau said no classroom aids can ever replace the teacher, but audio-visual technology can relieve him of certain routine tasks.

Normal schools should recognize this by giving training in audio-visual teaching methods.

**Children In Three States Get Fallout**

WASHINGTON (AP)—Children in Nevada, Utah and Idaho "probably" have received potentially dangerous doses of fallout radiation from both underground and atmospheric tests conducted at the Nevada nuclear testing site since 1951, the Greater St. Louis Citizens' Committee for Nuclear Information said Wednesday.

The group also charged that government fallout monitoring procedures in the Nevada test site regions have been inadequate.

The committee, through a representative, offered a statement to that effect at fallout hearings being conducted by the Senate House of Representatives atomic energy committee. A top Atomic Energy Commission scientist told a reporter later the entire statement is refutable.

**REPORT EARNINGS RISE**

MONTREAL (CP)—Westburne Oil Co. Ltd. Thursday reported net earnings of \$432,900 for the first six months of this year, compared with \$285,444 for the corresponding period last year. Crude oil sales after royalties were \$637,000 for the six months ended last June 30, up from \$502,811 for the first half of last year.
