Over Million Dollars In Cash Payments Since Dec. 1

Since December 1st, the National Employment Office in Charlottetown has paid in cash, over the counter, to residents of Charlottetown \$273,114.00 in benefit claims. The highest amount of money paid in any one day was \$5,992. The number of people dawning benefits in Charlottetown averaged between 900 and 1000 for a good part of the winter, a good indication to these, more than 3000 people in Kings and Queens Counties were also claimants. These people are paid by warrant every two weeks.
