# Hope Dims For Missing Couple

INVERNESS, N. S. (CP)—Hope dimmed Wednesday night for a missing lightkeeper and his wife from lonely Sea Wolf island off Cape Breton's west coast.

Alex John MacLellan, 52, and his wife, Christina, 41, put out in their 20-foot boat nearby Broad Cove Marsh at 4:50 p. m. Tuesday to return to the outpost from a visit to the mainland. The light didn't come on Tuesday night.

Their waterlogged boat, one side smashed, was found Wednesday afternoon by an RCMP search party at Chimney Corner, six miles northeast of Sea Wolf island on the mainland shore. There was no sign of the MacLellans.
