A very fast service across the lakes will be inaugurated by the C. P. R. Co. when navigation opens, as it is the intention to only occupy two days in going from port port. The time to be taken by the Great Northern boats from Duluth to Buffalo is three days.

News has been received that a Spanish column under the command of Col. Elok, while marching from San Jose to Valiente near Cienfuegos, came upon a party of 2,000 rebels holding a strong position and attacked them. The official report of the engagement, says the rebels were dislodged from their positions by a brilliant charge and leaving 16 dead upon the field. The Spanish loss was 1 killed and 6 wounded. From other sources it is learned that the rebel losses are exaggerated and that the losses of Spanish troops were much greater than the government admits.
