Yank Violation Is Charged Of Caribbean Agreement

MOSCOW (AP) - The Soviet Union has charged the United States is violating the Caribbean agreement that eased the Car-Sagua, on Cuba's north coast, missile crisis by backing it declared the United States and other allies making it specifically protested an attack on the Soviet freighter Logov, U.S. ships on Cuba's north coast, shot up by the March 17 at the sugar port of Isabela de Sagua Tuesday night.

A spokesman for a Cuban exile organization called Comandante Lora said a raiding party severely damaged the freighter and left it in need of repairs. He said the raiders returned without casualties but that some were in the Caribbean.

Premier Khrushchev's government reacted to the Logov incident. The note called on the U.S. government for "resolute measures to prevent similar provocative actions in the future."
