

Record Water Shipments To The Northland

MONTREAL, (CP)—A record number of ships will ply the shipping lanes in Canada's northland during June and July, shipping officials said Tuesday.

Between 20 and 25 ships of various types, from schooners to coastal freighters, will carry supplies to settlements expanding with government and commercial development of the area.

Lack of adequate docking facilities is said to be one of the main drawbacks to extensive shipping. In many cases where there are no government docks, cargoes have to be transferred to lighters and unloaded from these smaller ships on the beach.

Machinery, food, medical supplies and equipment for bulk stations will make up most of the cargoes. Among ports to be touched will be Fort Chimo, Ungava Bay; Chesterfield Inlet, Frobisher Bay, Baker Lake and ports along Baffin Island.

Big Rush In Britain For Coronation Souvenirs

LONDON, (Reuters) — There is still a big rush in Britain for Coronation souvenirs. The boom is expected to continue long after the last legal robes are back in mothballs.

Most popular gift to mark the event of a lifetime is the specially-minted silver "crown" or five-shilling piece worth 70 cents, showing the Queen on horseback.

The Royal Mint has struck 5,000,000 of these pieces and there still is a steady demand.

Coronation throne to plaques for tree-planters with a crown and the inscription: "Planted by . . . to commemorate the Coronation of H. M. Queen Elizabeth II."

Prized souvenirs will be the 2,000 chairs and 5,700 stools spec-

ially made for guests in Westminster Abbey last Tuesday. They are of oak and beech, upholstered in blue velvet with gold braid piping.

As in 1937, each guest will have first offer of the chair or stool he or she sat on. At the Coronation of George VI, chairs sold for 25 shillings (then \$5) and stools for £2 (then \$8). The government has not yet decided how much to charge this time.

Whatever the price, the chairs and stools will be good security. Their value will increase yearly as collectors' pieces.

OTTAWA, (CP)—Canada's Indian population has increased approximately 10,000 since the last Indian census four years ago, a spokesman for Indian affairs disclosed Tuesday. Ontario had the largest number of Indians, 34,500; British Columbia was next with 23,000. Prince Edward Island has 270 Indians listed.

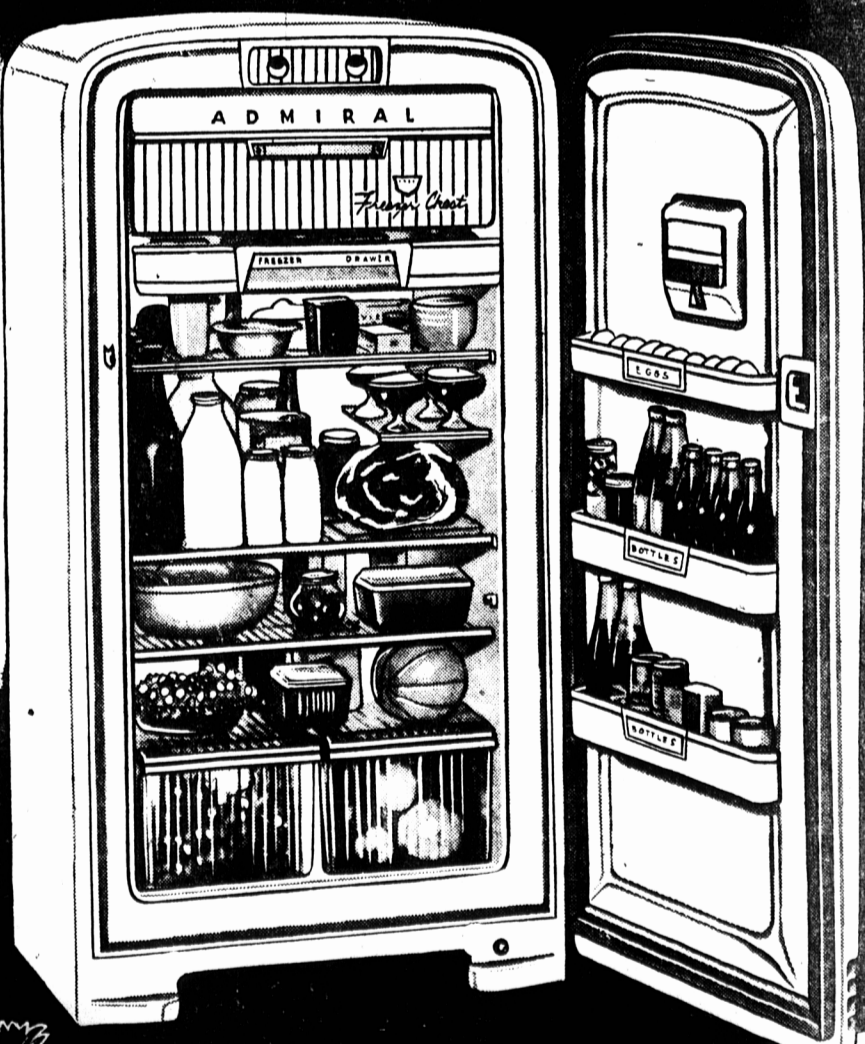

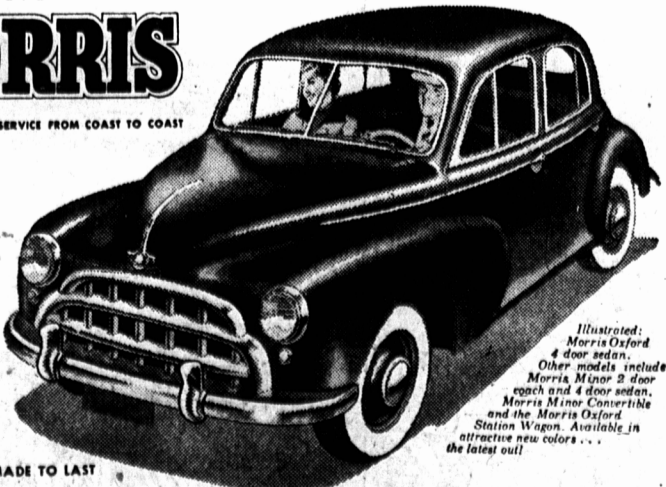
