



# Bud Smith Wins Lightweight Crown By 15 Round Split-Decision Over Carter

BOSTON, (AP)—Wallace (Bud) Smith, a jolting left-hook artist from Cincinnati, won the world's lightweight boxing championship Wednesday night with a divided decision over Jimmy Carter in a bruising 15-round bout in hot and humid Boston Garden.

Referee Mel Manning scored it 140 to 47 for Smith and judge Joe Heitz had the Cincinnati battler ahead 145 to 44. Judge John Glynn called it even 144-144. Smith, 134, pounded Carter, 134 1/2, at close quarters and opened cuts over both the defending champion's eyes.

The new champion took all of Carter's heavy blows to the body and fought back to win the title in a furious brawl.

## Horseshoe Club Opens Saturday

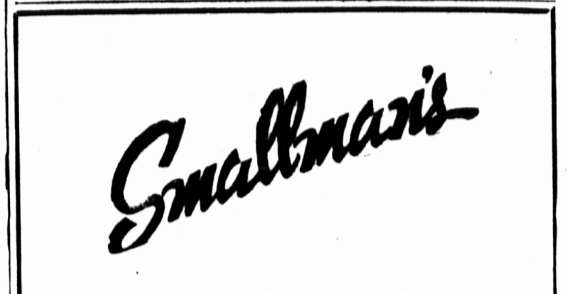
