A very enjoyable social evening was spent in the vestry of the Bedeque United Church on Tuesday evening May 6th. When about 50 members of Trinity Men's Association, Charlottetown, were entertained at a supper meeting which was put on by the Bedeque Y.W.A. sponsored by some 37 men of the Bedeque United Church congregation desirous of forming a Men's Association in Bedeque.

Rev. Burton Crowe asked the blessing. Mr. Jack McNair, Charlottetown, ably acted as chairman and in his jovial manner conducted the meeting and explained the objects and course of procedure of the Men's Association, good fellowship being the motto.

Mr. Walter Crockett was the song leader with Mrs. Jack McNair, organist, as the Trinity members staged their regular meeting for the benefit of the Bedeque friends. Addresses were given by the leader, Mr. Jack McNair, Rev. H. E. D. Ashford, Mr. Walter R. Shaw, Rev. John Irving and Rev. Burton Crowe.

Mr. Ralph Calbeck gave an address of welcome to the visitors and was responded to by Mr. McNair, who expressed the thanks of the visitors for the bounteous supper and paid a special compliment to the Y.P.A. leader, Mrs. Norman McFarlane, for her leadership in the work, to which Mrs. McFarlane very graciously replied.

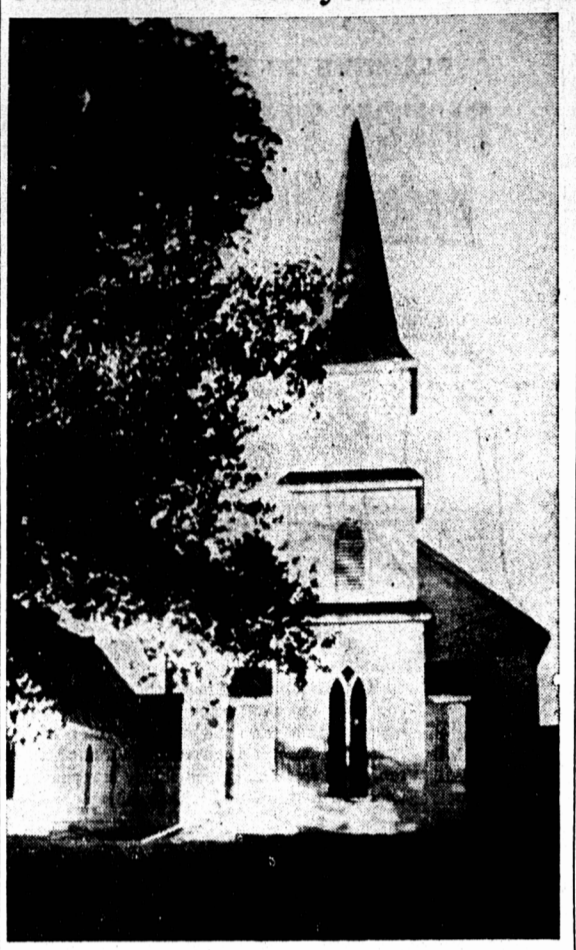
Short addresses were given by Messrs Ralph Calbeck, Cyril McFarlane, Harrison McFarlane, Arnold Henderson, T. J. Inman, W. J. Reid and others expressing the desirability of forming a Men's Association in Bedeque. Rev. Summerside Presbyterian Church



The Summerside Presbyterian Church, the oldest church building in the town, was formally dedicated on March 19, 1865, with Rev. R. S. Patterson of Bedeque, Rev. W. R. Frame of Lot 16 and Summerside, and Rev. Isaac Murray of Cavendish officiating.

Presbyterian worship began, at Green's Shore, now Summerside, about 1853 with Rev. J. M. MacLeod of Richmond Bay and Rev. R. S. Patterson conducting services on alternate Saturdays in a private home in front of where the old hospital stands.

At this time there were but 12 houses at Green's Shore with no church nor school. When the school was erected both Presbyterians and Methodists worshipped there, and this building still stands at the west end of the town and is now in use as a grocery store. The growth in population became so phenomenal, attracted by the shipbuilding and the bi-weekly communication with the mainland, that the congregation continually outgrew its quarters. In 1854 Brown's Hall was used until the present church was completed.

The members of the P. E. I. Presbytery in 1856 purchased a lot of land from Mr. Joseph Green, but it was not until 1862 that the foundation of the church was laid and three years later completed. The lumber was hauled from Weland's Point. The committee who supervised the building consisted of Messrs. R. Glover, Thomas Brehaut, James Muirhead and Colin MacLennan.

This church was constructed during the greatest missionary era of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. The pioneer missionary, Rev. John Geddie, then on furlough preached here in 1805. This congregation was included, at first, in the Richmond Bay parish and later was attached to Lot 16 when Rev. W. R. Frame was inducted as pastor. The elders at that time were: Messrs. Anthony Craswell, George Linkletter, Rodrick MacLean and Hugh Carr.

In 1871 the Summerside church became a separate charge and a Bill of Incorporation, sponsored by Hon. James Muirhead, passed the Legislature on March 17. The first Board of Trustees comprised Messrs. William Brehaut, Robert Glover, Thomas B. Hall, William Henry Brown and David Montgomery. Rev. Neil MacKay, the first resident minister, was inducted in 1873 and labored acceptably for 13 years. The church was enlarged during his pastorate to accommodate 200 additional adherents. The finances were procured by each family paying for its respective pew.

Early Records Destroyed

The early church records were destroyed by fire on the first P. E. I. Icebreaker, The Northern Light, which plied between Georgetown and Pictou, N.S. The steamer, caught in an ice jam, was held up for one month, and the fuel became exhausted, making it necessary to burn a portion of the cargo and all books and papers. Among them were the valuable church papers in charge of Rev. Neil MacKay, who was on his way to attend Presbytery in Nova Scotia.

A new act of incorporation was passed in 1883 and the following trustees were elected: Messrs. William H. Brown, Joseph Linkletter, Theophilus J. Clark, Daniel Stewart, Neil Sinclair, David Montgomery and Neil MacKelvie. After the resignation of Rev. Neil MacKay, Rev. J. P. Gerrit, known as the singing evangelist, was inducted and remained for one year. The Summerside Presbyterian Church had always been a missionary church and in 1888, when she was supporting a home missionary in British Columbia, the people there in gratefulness to this congregation named their village Summerside, B.C. Rev. Henry Dickie, the next pastor, was inducted in 1888. During his ministry of six years, the Sunday School Hall was erected and dedicated. (1891). His resignation was accepted with deep sorrow and regret. Rev. E. M. Dill, D.D., succeeded until 1898 when Rev. W. H. Smith, Ph.D.,

the able and popular pastor, was inducted. He remained until 1904 when Rev. R. G. Strathie became the minister.

The original choir was seated in the gallery and was trained by Mr. Henry Walker, precursor, who used a tuning fork to obtain the correct pitch. A small organ had been purchased but met with such opposition that for some time it was left unused in the church. However, prejudice gradually disappeared and Mrs. Douglas Gordon became the first church organist. The present organist is Mrs. Cleve Whalen. In 1908 a two-manual pipe organ was installed through the generosity of Mr. N. Bruce MacKelvie of New York, in loving memory of his mother, Mrs. Lizzie Stewart MacKelvie.

Minister

Rev. Hugh J. Fraser was inducted in 1911 and succeeded in 1917 by Rev. George Mitchell, B. D., who remained after the Union in 1925 when five elders and 90 members withdrew to the United Church. In 1927 Rev. C. J. St. Clair Jeans was inducted and succeeded by Rev. Walter McCleary in 1935 and Rev. William Verwoife in 1937. Rev. Charles Carnegie was inducted in 1943 and the present minister, Rev. Donald MacKay, who was inducted in 1950, is a relative of Rev. Neil MacKay, the first resident minister, and his brother, Dr. Daniel MacKay, a beloved physician and member of the church session.

The eightieth anniversary of the church was commemorated in 1942 while Rev. Wm. Verwoife was minister. The guest speaker was Rev. C. J. St. Clair Jeans. In June of the same year a beautiful solid oak communion table was presented by Mrs. MacLean in memory of her husband, A. E. MacLean, M.P.

The next year, an oak baptismal font, in keeping with the other church furniture, was donated by the MacMudro brothers, in memory of their parents, William and Agnes Brehaut MacMudro. The Bible on the Communion Table was given in 1944 by Mr. Ralph Ramsay in memory of his mother, Mrs. Sadie Ramsay, and was the family Bible of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Fraser. The Pulpit Bible was presented on December 25, 1900 by the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor.

Veteran's Plaque

On the north wall of the church is a plaque in memory of the following men of this congregation who gave their lives in the Great War of 1914-18: William Bishop, Herbert Gay, Thomas C. Hieffly, James Hickey, Pope Howatt, Claude Milligan, Allen McLeod, John C. McLeod, James M. MacKay, Stirling MacKay, E. Gordon Phillips, George W. Sharpe.

Another plaque is in Loving Memory of Theophilus D. Ramsay and his wife, Emma J. Caldwell, who devoted their lives to the welfare of the church. Through the years the church has been decorated within and without. The ground was enlarged by the removal of the old horse shed which had accommodated so many horses owned by members from the outlying districts. Last year the aisles of the church were carpeted and the steeple of the church repaired, having previously been struck by lightning.

The congregation has been steadily increasing in membership, the Easter Communion being the largest in the history of the church since 1925. In all its work and activities, this church nobly maintains the tradition of the Presbyterian Church in Canada.
