Unemployment Insurance Fund Cut To Danger Level

OTTAWA (CP)—The unemployment insurance advisory committee says the drain on the unemployment insurance fund in recent months has reduced its reserves below the safe level.

It points to the record drain of \$134,200,124 on the fund during the fiscal year ended last March 31 and indications of further heavy withdrawals subsequently.

"The seriousness of this," the committee said in a report following its last meeting here, "is that it reduces the reserve below the standard accepted by authorities as safe."

The advisory committee, comprising four employer and four employee representatives, met last month under chairmanship of retired Deputy Labor Minister Arthur MacNamara, the government's appointee. Its report now has been tabled in the Commons.
