

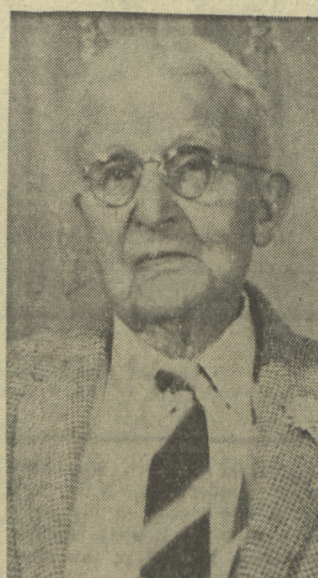
### Rod Innis Elected To 4th Term As Branch President

Dr. Dewar graduated from McGill University in 1893. Active in politics, the venerable doctor was elected to represent the district of Port Augustus in the legislature in 1911 in a by-election and again in 1912 at a general election. Dr. Dewar practiced medicine in Charlottetown and Southport for more than 40 years prior to his retirement in 1943.
