Prominent Men Leading the Way To Relief of Starving Children



Prominent Canadians are identified with the administration of the Save the Children Fund, otherwise known as the Russian Famine Relief, which has its headquarters in Ottawa. Among those on the Executive of the Canadian Committee are the above gentlemen. Hon. Mr. King is Honorary President. Col. Mackie, President. Hon. Mr. Meighen, Hon. Mr. Crerar and Hon. Mr. Lemieux Vice-Presidents. Sir Louis Davies, Deputy Governor-General, Honorary Secretary. Hon. W. S. Fielding, Honorary Treasurer, and Sir George Burn, a former president of the Canadian Bankers' Association, Treasurer. Already sufficient money has been subscribed in Canada to feed 50,000 starving children until next August but notwithstanding this generous relief hundreds of thousands will perish unless help is forthcoming immediately. Twenty-five cents will feed one child for a week on a good diet—or one dollar for a month. Five dollars will provide for one hungry child until next harvest. Foodstuffs only are sent from Canada.

The Toll of Death in Russia

TEN MILLION CHILDREN in Russia are doomed to die in the slow agonies of starvation unless the people of Canada awaken in their generosity, and by gifts of food and money, enable the Save the Children Fund to prevent this horror.

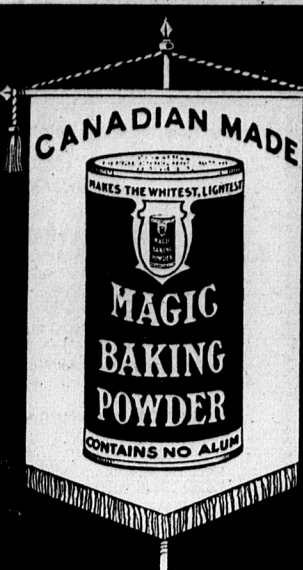
Says Canada Is Not Full-Fledged Nation

VICTORIA, B.C., May 6.—Spoke of, His Lordship said that "any of Canada's national status at one of the states across the border a banquet here of the native sons can do anything which the whole of Canada, Mr. Justice Martin, of Canada cannot do without the British Columbia Court of Appeal to an amendment to the British peals, declared that "Canada's North America Act," and he ex-
