LARGE MEETING OF FARMERS

An Able Address by Mr. Dillon

Cheese and Butter Factory to be Established in Lot 48—Canvassing Committee Appointed.

A meeting of farmers interested in the establishment of a cheese and butter factory in Lot 48 was held at Hazelbrook at 2 o'clock yesterday.

The cost of starting a cheese and butter factory would be about \$5,000 and the milk of at least 300 cows would, from the outset, be required.

On motion of Patrick Duffy, Esq., the meeting adjourned to meet at Mount Herbert Hall on Thursday, 20th December inst., at 2 o'clock.

CHINA AND JAPAN.

At the Japanese Legation in Washington the disposition is to discredit the statements made by the Japanese semi-official press, and if the war were concluded the victorious nation would demand now an indemnity of 400,000,000 yen.

A despatch from official Japanese sources, giving an account of Commissioner Detring's peace mission, was received at Washington on the 4th, by a gentleman in the diplomatic service.
