DEATH OF MISS FANNIE MCCARTHY.

The mortuary roll of this city has not been especially lengthy of late. It has, however, been remarkable in other respects, for the reason, principally, that it contained the names of victims who were either well-known in the community or from whom, had their career not been cut short, brilliant and successful lives might have been expected.

In the present instance the deceased is a young lady possessed of those kindly qualities of heart and disposition that endeared her to all with whom she met. Miss Fannie McCarthy is the sister of James P. McCarthy, of the firm of McCarthy & Burke, recently established on Fourteen street, near Farnam.

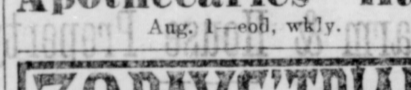
