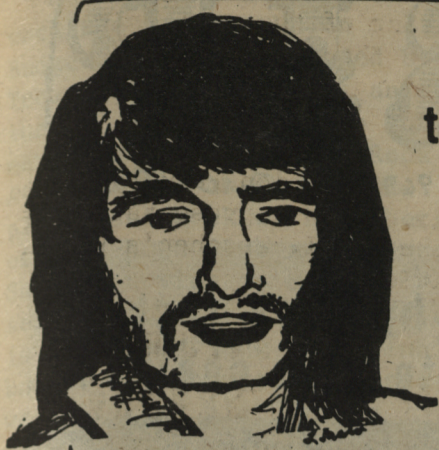


Who Turned Out the Lights in the Darkroom?
