MONSTROUS BOTTLENECK

Work is Revitalized

Montreal (CP) — The Quebec government announced Monday that it will start a major highway construction program in the province which will revitalize the province's economy.

The province's major highway project calls for the widening of existing bridges linking Montreal Island with the province's mainland. A section of the highway is now under construction at Dorion, in addition to the bridge at the Ile Perrot end.

The delay has been in the new span under construction, and now about 150 vehicles a day are stuck in traffic on the bridge at the west end of Montreal Island.

TRAFFIC FUNNELED
At present, traffic at this point is funnelled through the narrow, two-lane Githceliac Bridge, one of the chief and busiest entrances to Montreal. On week ends and holiday periods, traffic has been known to pile up for five miles.

Work on the St. Anne de Bellevue Bridge bogged down February by the same dispute about the quality of the construction between company and government engineers.

Mr. St. Pierre said the government ordered Donolo to cease work on the bridge.

"Acting on the recommendation of its consulting engineers, the government has decided to create a new bridge," he said.

The bridge will be financed by the public works department," Mr. St. Pierre said.

"Since this contractor did not remove the defective structural members from the construction site in the time allowed him, his contract has been cancelled," he said.

"The public works department has itself placed an order for new steelwork and a specialty firm, and has ordered the work to proceed."
