I have the honor to enclose copy of an official Notification enjoining that no travellers are henceforth to be allowed to enter the United States, from a Foreign Country, without a Passport; and in the case of Aliens, such Passports are to be countersigned by a Diplomatic or Consular-Agent of the United States.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE,

Washington, Dec. 17, 1864.

The President directs that, except immigrant passengers directly entering an American port by sea, henceforth no traveller shall be allowed to enter the United States from a foreign country, without a passport. If a citizen, the passport must be from this department, or from some United States Minister or Consul abroad; and if an alien, from the competent authority of his own country; the passport to be countersigned by a diplomatic or Consular-Agent of the United States. This regulation is intended to apply especially to persons proposing to come to the United States from the neighbouring British Provinces. Its observance will be strictly enforced by all officers, civil, military and naval, in the service of the United States, and the State and municipal authorities are requested to aid in its execution. It is expected, however, that no immigrant passenger, coming in manner aforesaid, will be obstructed, or any other persons who may set out on their way hither before intelligence of this regulation could reasonably be expected to reach the country from which they may have started.
