Miss Audrey Jay, Sherwood, spent the weekend with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Levi Jay.

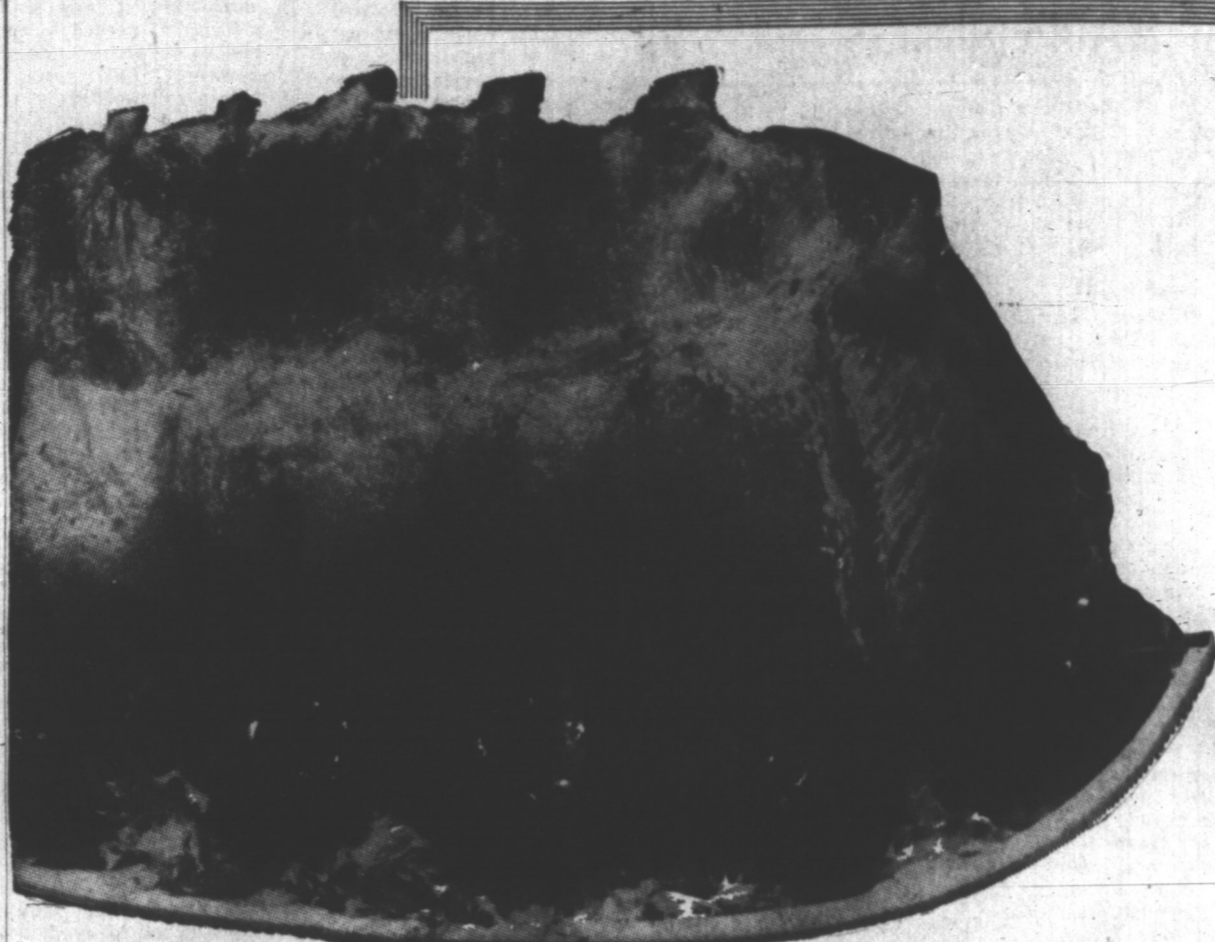

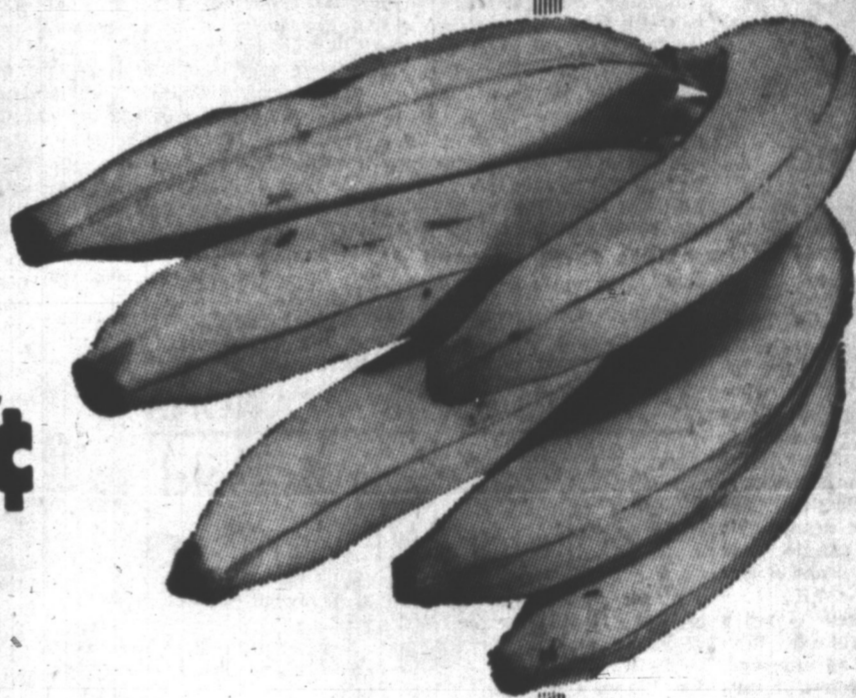

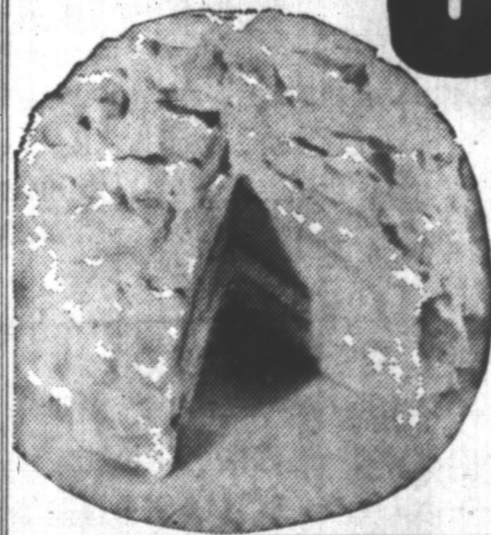
