## Atlantics Increase Lead With 5-4 Victory Over Shorthanded Islanders

HALIFAX, (CP)—Halifax Atlantics increased their lead in the Maritime Major Hockey League Saturday, defeating the second-place Charlottetown Islanders 5-4 in a game that lacked the usual fireworks.

A paid crowd of 5,385 saw the Atlantics play in spurts against the Islanders who dressed only 11 men, one a junior, because of injuries.

Marcel Clements scored three of the Charlottetown goals and Ron Hurst fired the other.

Bill Ford shot two for the Atlantics and the others went to Frank Bergeron, Hughie Campbell and Doug McPhee.

Held to a 2-2 tie in the first period, the Atlantics broke through for three goals in the second while Charlottetown scored only one. Halifax dominated the period as the Islanders tired from the pace.

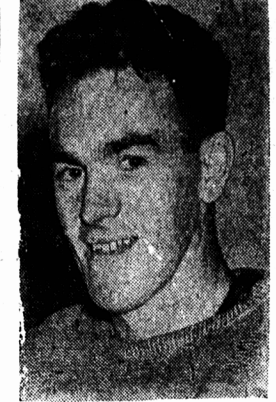
Holdaway is skating and should be back by the end of the week but Brklacich will be out until play-off time with his hand injury.

## Red Wings Score 2-1 Victory Over Rangers

NEW YORK, (AP)—Detroit Red Wings, on scores by Glen Skov and Tony Leswick, overcame a one-goal first-period deficit Sunday night to defeat New York's Rangers 2-1 before the season's largest crowd of 15,071 at Madison Square Garden.

Leswick scored the deciding tally at 2:57 of the second period when, after taking passes from Marcel Pronovost and Skov, he drilled a 15-footer past Lorne Worsley in the New York nets.

Rangers went ahead 1-0 on a goal by Neil Strain at 8:50 of the opening stanza. During a melee in front of the Detroit goal, Wally Hergeshimer fed to Strain in the left of the cage and the Ranger forward drove the puck past Terry Sawchuk, who was out of position.

Less than eight minutes later, the Red Wings knotted the count on Skov's goal. The play started with Gordie Howe dashing into the New York zone. He was hit by two defencemen but managed to get off a pass to Skov, who sent it neatly by Worsley into the left-hand corner of the cage.

Rangers tried desperately to notch the tying tally in the third period but could not get a cohesive attack under way. With one minute remaining they pulled Worsley out of the goal but Sawchuk and the Detroit defence were equal to the occasion.

## Big Fight In Junior Game At Sydney

NORTH SYDNEY, N. S. (CP)—Extra police were called in and several players required hospital treatment Saturday when players and fans tangled in an hour-long battle royal at a junior hockey game here.

Sydney Millionaires were awarded the game. They were leading Northside Franklins 10-3 with about six minutes remaining when the trouble started.

Bill Billock of the Franklins and Bob MacNeil, a juvenile brought up for the Cape Breton League finals, started the melee when they traded punches. Fights started all over the ice, other players poured out of the boxes and fans followed.

Sydney reported three players required hospital care and the Franklins said some of theirs also needed treatment.

Thirty-one penalties were called up to the point of the minor explosion, Sydney getting 15 minors and two misconducts and the Franklins 14 minors.

## Wallop Mount Allison 75-39 Here Saturday; Reardon Scores 29

The Saint Dunstan's University basketball team chalked up another first here on Saturday night when they defeated the Mount Allison University quintet 75-39 to win the N.B.-P.E.I. Intercollegiate Basketball League. The League was the first for S.D.U. in intercollegiate hoop circles.

The Saints, who have won four games in four starts in intercollegiate play, still have two games left. They will meet St. Thomas University on Friday and the University of New Brunswick on Saturday but regardless of the outcome of those games the Saints can not be ousted from first place.

Saint Dunstan's will meet St. F. X. in the finals for the Maritime intercollegiate championship in a two-game series. This series will likely take place during the first and second weeks of March.

The Saints put together a red-hot shooting display and a stone-wall defense in the second half to defeat the Allisons in their game here Saturday. After a shaky first half the Saints were ahead by only a 20-26 count.

But so strong was the Saints' defense in the second half that the visiting hoopers could break through for only three field goals. For the first fourteen minutes of the last half the visitor's didn't score a basket.

In the meantime the Saints, led by Jack Reardon and his hook shot, were piling up points. In the third quarter alone the Saints scored 28 points against six by the Mounties. During one stretch the Saints scored 30 points before the Mounties scored a basket.

Reardon scored 13 field goals and three free throws for a total of 29 points, his lowest point total in intercollegiate play this season. Johnny Taylor also came up with a sharp shooting display, collecting 16 points. Bob Mooney of the Saints was third high scorer with nine.

Bain of the Mounties, was high man for the losers. Baxter and Yeardon each scored eight.

The Saints' shooting was erratic in the first half as they connected on only 12 out of 54 shots for a percentage of 22. In the last half they scored on 21 of their 37 tries for an average of 57%. Their game average was 36%.

The Mounties made eight out of 20 shots in the first half for 40% and three out of 29 shots in the last twenty minutes for only 10%. Their game average was 23%.

During the last half the Saints displayed shifting man for man defense which kept the Mounties from getting in close to the S.D.U. basket. Many of the 29 shots the Mounties took in this half were from well out.

The game was capably handled by P.L. Dean of the R.C.A.F. and Earl Nicholson of Charlottetown.
