## Special M.A. Scholarships

Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada for 1979-80 are offering approx. 100 awards which are available to Canadian students of exceptional promise for studies at Canadian Universities.

## The Queen's Fellowships

To commemorate the 1973 visit to Canada of Queen Elizabeth II, the Government of Canada has established an endowment fund which provides for three fellowships. The recipients are selected from among the Special M.A. Scholarship applicants who wish to pursue a Master's program in Canadian studies.

## The Canadian Federation of University Women

Margaret Dale Philp Award (\$500) donated by Kitchener-Waterloo Club, CFUW.

This award is open to any woman scholar who holds a Baccalaureate or equivalent degree from a Canadian university, who resides in Canada and who wishes to embark on, or continue a program leading to an advanced degree in the field of humanities or Social Science. Special consideration will be given to candidates who wish to specialize in Canadian history.

Alice E. Wilson Grants (\$500) These grants are to assist women wishing to do refresher work in their chosen field, to do specialized study, or to retain in new techniques applicable to their field. Applicants must have a bachelor's degree or equivalent from an accredited university.

Professional Fellowship (\$500) This Fellowship is open to any woman who has completed a degree from a Canadian university and who wishes to pursue graduate work at an accredited professional school. One or two Professional Fellowships are awarded.

NOTE: A Candidate for any of the above awards must be a citizen or must have landed immigrant status for one year prior to submitting application. Deadline for completed applications for the CFUW Awards: Feb. 1, 1979.
