successfully obtained congressional action in 1951 to insert a rider in the American Defence Production Act allowing the U.S. agriculture department to impose import curbs when the American industry was over-stocked.

The restrictions imposed on cheese, dried skim milk, butter, and vegetable oil products were continued when the legislation came up for renewal in June, 1952.

Then the U.S. agriculture department announced last December that the curbs would be extended to dried whole milk, dried buttermilk and dried cream products. Tiny quotas were allowed for the first three months of 1953. Now, with the embargo, these quotas are being withdrawn.

One heartening point is that President Eisenhower has shown he favors expanding world trade. Officials hope that with the world crisis easing, Congress may be urged to allow the Defence Production Act to lapse or replace it with some other legislation, eliminating the dairy curbs.

contest would probably come June 8.

The Vancouver Daily Province quoted "authoritative sources" as saying the lieutenant-governor would refuse Mr. Winch's bid to become B. C.'s first C.C.F. premier. Mr. Winch, 44, has been a member of the legislature for 20 years.

The constitutional issue was the first to arise in B. C. since 1900. At that time, Joseph Martin—there were no political parties in B. C. then—was asked to form a government after the administration of C. A. Semlin collapsed. But Mr. Martin was the only one to vote for Mr. Martin in a confidence motion.

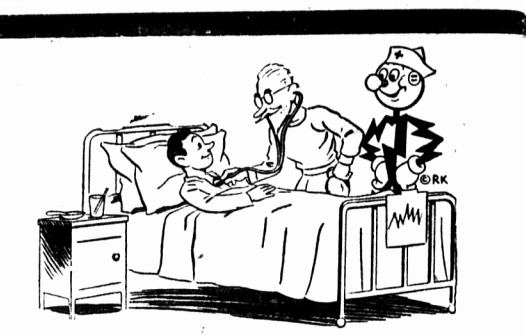
Canadian Dollar
