

Ont. Liberals Form Policy On Education

TORONTO (CP) — A policy statement on education issued by the Ontario Liberal party calls for compulsory school attendance from kindergarten to age 18.

The Liberals claim the province's education system is giving rise to two classes of students—the haves and the have-nots. The latter are referred to as "culturally disadvantaged" children.

This category mainly includes children of immigrants and the native poor, says the Liberal white paper.

"Because they start behind other students, culturally disadvantaged children are often the first to drop out (of school). Because they don't have a good education they get the left-over jobs in our complex and increasingly automated society."

"Because they have an uncertain job (or are unemployed) their own children start school at a disadvantage."

The Liberal policy statement says it is shocking that provincial school attendance laws have not been changed since 1919. Children should be required to attend school at age 5, not 8 as under present law.

"It may come as a surprise to some," the Liberals say, "but we are convinced part of the program to alleviate the bad side effects of automation must start in the province's kindergartens."

Many Canadians Handicapped By Disability

OTTAWA (CP)—Some 1,300,000 Canadians have a permanent physical disability and have to be poverty-stricken to get government aid, a report to the federal-provincial conference on poverty suggests.

The profile on disability said \$1,671 persons qualified in January this year under the disabled persons act for an average \$69.45 a month.

"Last year nearly 10,000 persons were turned away because their disability was not assessed as total or permanent though many were severely handicapped," a report by the federal government's special planning secretariat on poverty said.

Another 567 applicants were "not quite poor enough" to qualify for the maximum aid of \$600 a year.

DIED WITHOUT AID
The report said 223 died before a decision was made on their applications.

The act sets the maximum allowable income in families where disability assistance is paid at \$2,220 a year. For a single person the figure is \$1,260.

The report said 8,581 blind persons received an average \$68.12 a month in payments last year.

"Of the applicants, 304 were not blind enough and 66 were not poor enough to qualify."

The report said a substantial number of disabled probably never bothered to apply for aid for various reasons, among them the feeling they wouldn't qualify.

Nevertheless, indications were that 1,300,000 Canadians had a permanent physical disability. This excluded mental illness and retardation.

Rumors Aid Lab Stocks

NEW YORK (CP)—Shares of Abbott Laboratories have jumped \$3.36 on the New York Stock Exchange as the result of rumors of new anti-cancer drugs.

Commenting on the rumors, the company said it has drugs for treatment of rare blood cancer, awaiting approval of the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.

The company's stock closed at \$45.75 a share. Turnover was \$5,100 shares.
