home was selected as first for the county, Lloyd Lockerby of Hamilton was popular choice for first in Prince and Edwin Reid of Rollo Bay, first for King's.

Eight entries in Community Improvement were received, twenty-three in School Improvement, and six for Rural Cemetery Improvement. Top award for communities went to Breadalbane, second to Hunter River and third to Brackley, all three making extensive improvements. Breadalbane painted its attractive new library building, graded, seeded a new lawn, erected a fence and flagpole and planted flowers. One church was completely repainted, another had a new roof added. The appearance of the cemetery was greatly improved, and several private homes were painted or repainted. Hunter River community repainted the library building, fenced the area, planted shrubs and developed a lawn. A nearby church was painted and repaired, another church put in a new lawn and planted flowers, adding much to an already very attractive community. In Brackley, the school and surroundings were much improved and private dwellings kept to this community's high standard.

In cemetery improvement Brudenell did an outstanding job in beautifying an old and large cemetery area. Lawns were perfectly kept, the cemetery fences painted, stones straightened, trees planted.

placing second, has a new wire fence, lawns in good condition, an old church building was removed. Breadalbane cemetery was graded and new lawn planted, flowers and trees planted, fence painted.

SCHOOL COMPETITION—The School Improvement competition was well contested. Little York school won top award with an entry of which any community might be proud. The groups and general appearance of this school are well worthy a personal inspection by interested school trustees. Clermont school was second place with a first rate effort. Fredericton and Springfield schools were much improved.

The Roadside Improvement award goes to Allison MacLeod of Spring Brook with an outstanding entry. His frontage of approximately seven chains was graded and sloped and seeded into lawn, a woven wire fence with turned posts was erected and planted trees, chiefly maples were planted. Runners up were Mr. J. L. Dewar, New Perth, Keith Gard, Mill River East, and John Hunter, Strathcona.

Col. Johnstone commented on the fine effort made by this year's contestants, and the evidence throughout the Province of a deep interest in rural beautification.
